The 17 Sustainable Development Goals represent the culmination of a global multi-year development effort to protect the environment and promote social cohesion. As such, they reflect the concerns of the public at the time of their design and comprise a unique and widely accepted combination of ethical values and policies. Their implementation is left to their broad acceptance by the main “players”—the business community and governments. This explains their significant but somewhat limited success on an international scale.

In the past few years, a series of international crises, such as the outbreak of the pandemic and the war in Ukraine, and their consequent impact on the economy, have affected the development of actions to achieve the Goals. Nevertheless, they continue to be, internationally, the main guide that defines values and desirable actions accepted by society.

The 17 Goals are based on the linear assumption that, as in the past, humanity could reduce negative socioeconomic impacts. This hypothesis is being challenged today by the speed and complexity of changes in economic and social life, as well as technology.

The environment, in its wider sense, is changing at a significant rate and in directions that due to increased uncertainty cannot be easily predicted. In the context of the Sustainable Development Goals of the 2030 Agenda, there is an urgent need for Greece's economic and social policy to commit to a human-centered development model

The impact of multiple crises on the world of work has exposed the weaknesses of the economy and social protection system and highlighted entrenched inequalities and labour market segmentation in Greece. The available empirical data show that despite the recovery of the Gross Domestic Product, Greece has the second highest unemployment rate, while recording the lowest employment rate among young people under 25 and the second lowest employment rate among both 20-64-year-olds and women among the EU-27. The real average wage has decreased significantly, which in 2022 reached 8,7% compared to 2021. This development led to a distribution gap at the expense of workers of 8.4% in 2021 and 9.5% in 2022.

The quality of work in Greece is among the lowest among the EU-27 in characteristics such as working time, work-life balance, collective representation and professional development. These findings document the limits of a production model based on low-productivity, low value-added, low stability and high working hours. At the same time in 2022 in Greece, 13.2% of men and 14.6% of women were unable to meet basic needs for a decent living, while 43.6% of households declared inability to meet an emergency expenditure.

In the context of the Sustainable Development Goals of the 2030 Agenda, there is an urgent need for Greece's economic and social policy to commit to a human-centered development model that will prioritize social equity and inclusion, economic resilience, environmental sustainability, the creation of conditions of full, productive and decent employment and the strengthening of collective bargaining. Sustainable work is a key condition for strengthening our democracy.

The Central Union of Municipalities of Greece has placed high on the agenda of its political dialogue and programmatic goals, the adoption and implementation of certain actions by the Local Self-Government, which aim to achieve the goals of sustainable development.

We have pointed out that in principle three basic steps are required to make this possible:

- ▶ First, identifying and registering local needs, since each city has different local characteristics, which must be considered.
- ▶ Secondly, early preparation of the political organizations, so that they can diagnose the specific needs.
- ▶ Thirdly, preparation and activation of local communities, regarding the changes that will occur in their daily life.

It is now commonly accepted that we must change and overturn habits of many years. The transition will not be easy, but the Local Government has proven that it can respond to the demands of the times.

The Covenant of Mayors, which is a binding policy text, focuses on 4 axes. Energy, Waste management, Sustainable mobility, Citizen participation. Concerning energy, our priorities are the reduction of consumption and the production and storage of clean energy. We understand that it makes no sense to simply produce clean energy, if at the same time we do not reduce consumption, and we are already working towards this direction. Promoting the model

of energy communities serves our goals, while the further utilization of Renewable Energy Sources (RES), makes it necessary to find modern storage solutions, so that we can retain energy until we need it.

Regarding waste management, the Municipalities want to have a more active role. Not simply picking up trash, as some wish to limit our role, but promoting another model of management, which will adopt the principles of the circular economy and give importance to recycling and reuse. To be more exact, by establishing specific rules in recycling, with the State in a regulatory role. Also, by letting the Municipalities use the resources of the burial tax, when they are collected, to finance sorting programs at the source and recovery units for recycling materials. It should be pointed out however that KEDE has disagreed with the establishment of the burial tax from the beginning.

In sustainable mobility, we have the opportunity to take advantage of the many financial programs at our disposal (A. Tritsis, Recovery Fund, NSRF).

Already, with proposals that exceeded 1.5 billion euros, Greek Municipalities are attempting to raise resources for greener and more sustainable cities, which will also bring a positive development sign to society.

Finally, it should be pointed out that any attempt regarding sustainable development will not be successful if citizens do not actively participate in our efforts.

Achievements of SDGs at the European and Greek level

Achievements of SDGs at the European and Greek level

Introduction

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), introduced by the United Nations in 2015, have emerged as a framework for addressing global challenges and promoting sustainable development worldwide. They encompass a wide range of interrelated social, economic, and environmental objectives, with the aim of achieving a more inclusive, resilient, and sustainable future by 2030.

This article aims to outline the level of achievements of the SDGs in Greece compared to the rest of the Europe and highlight the most challenging areas, according to the Sustainable Development Report 2022 for Europe. Next, it presents the findings from a study on the status of the SDGs in the 13 Greek regions and concludes with some recommendations.

Overall SDG achievement

Halfway through the 2030 Agenda, the world is still far from achieving the SDGs. According to the Global Sustainable Development Report 2023, the progress noticed for 2022 globally, was particularly limited in the SDGs addressing responsible consumption (SDG 12), climate action (SDG 13), life below water (SDG 14) and on land (SDG 15), even in countries that are key contributors to climate and biodiversity crises.¹

Figure 1 presents an overview of global average performances based on population weight for each goal. The goals associated with addressing hunger, promoting sustainable diets, and enhancing health outcomes are notably the most challenging. Similar underperformance is observed in goals concerning the preservation of terrestrial and marine biodiversity, the reduction of urban pollution, the provision of housing, the establishment of robust institutions, and the development of peaceful societies.

Likewise Global trends, Europe has shown considerable progress towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in certain areas, but it faces significant challenges, as well. According to the latest Europe Sustainable Development Report 2022,² Europe faces four main challenges in achieving the SDGs.

First, it demonstrates poor performance on goals related to hunger, climate, and biodiversity (Figure 2). This is mainly due to unsustainable food systems and greenhouse gas emissions, according to the Report. Second, while Europe is considered one of the most just continents around the world, persistent inequalities remain across population groups in some member states, particularly impacting vulnerable communities.

Third, there are considerable variations in SDG performance across different regions of Europe, with Northern and Western European countries typically outperforming Baltic, Southern, and Central and Eastern European countries. Lastly, Europe's international trade and financial practices often negatively impact other countries' ability to achieve their SDGs, despite the EU and its member states being the largest providers of development assistance in the world.

SDG achievement in Greece

Overall assessment

With an SDG Index Score of 65.7% for 2022, Greece lags behind the European average of 72%. Furthermore, its position at 27th out of 34 countries underscores the need for accelerating its efforts to meet the SDGs.

As shown in **Figure 3**, Greece faces "major challenges" in three areas: SDG 8 (Decent Work and Economic Growth), SDG 13 (Climate Action), and SDG 14 (Life Below Water). These are critical areas that need urgent attention and concerted efforts. Across a majority of the goals, Greece demonstrates "significant challenges" suggesting that, while there might be ongoing efforts in these areas, there is still substantial room for improvement. It worths to be noted that, Greece has a comparable performance with the European average in terms of SDG 12 (Responsible Consumption and Production) and SDG 17 (Partnership for the Goals) as both face "significant challenges". In SDG 10, Greece's score matches the EU average with "challenges remain," indicating progress in reduced inequalities.

SDG achievement in Greece at the regional level

The study of SDGs implementation at a regional level in Greece³ highlights the significance of local governance and policymaking in the broader context of sustainable development. It emphasizes the importance of targeted strategies and initiatives that can address the unique strengths and weaknesses of different regions, rather than a "one-size-fits-all" approach. This localized focus on SDG attainment is especially pertinent given that an estimated 65% of the SDG agenda could remain unfulfilled without significant contribution from local entities.

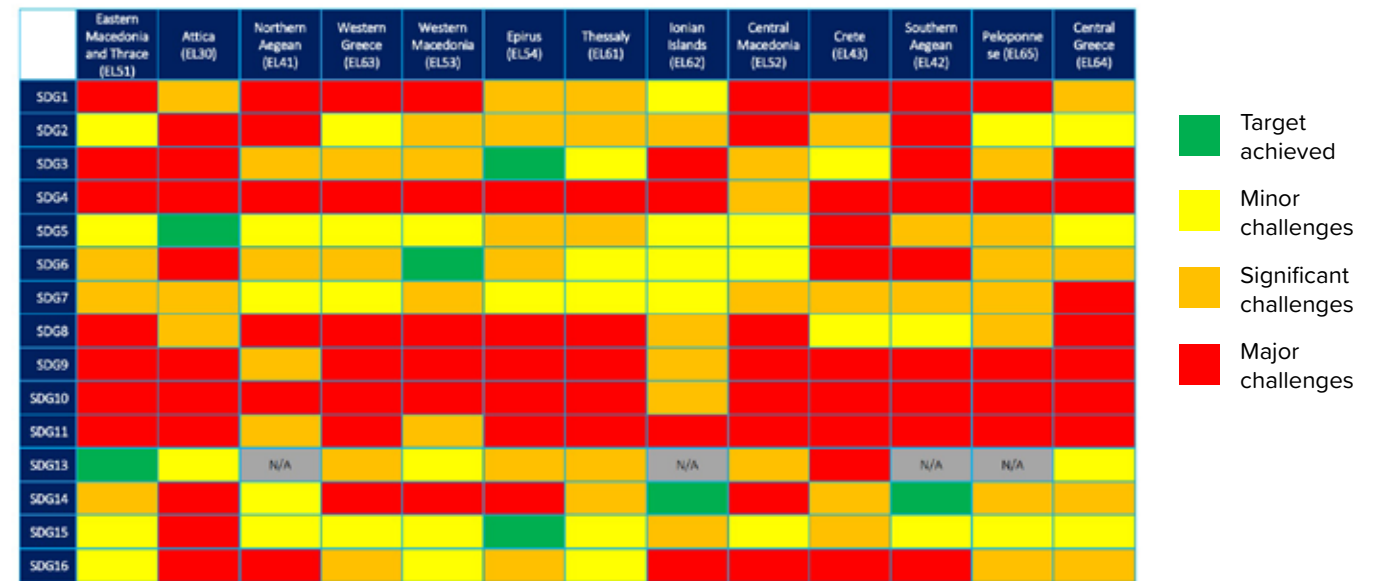


Figure 4 The performance of the 13 Greek Regions in achieving the SDGs. Source: Koundouri, P., et al., (2022)

As illustrated by **Figure 4**, Greek regions face significant challenges, particularly in eradicating poverty (SDG 1), fostering innovation and infrastructure (SDG 9), reducing inequalities (SDG 10), and creating sustainable cities and communities

(SDG 11). However, a better performance in promoting health and well-being (SDG 3), gender equality (SDG 5), economic growth (SDG 8), and climate action (SDG 13), can be noticed.

Further, regional disparities in SDG accomplishment are indicated by detailed results. Goals including "No Poverty" (SDG 1), "Quality Education" (SDG 4), "Decent Work and Economic Growth" (SDG 8), "Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure" (SDG 9), "Reduced Inequalities" (SDG 10), and "Sustainable Cities and Communities" (SDG 11) are yet to be achieved by any region.

Thessaly performs better than the other regions in terms of sustainability requirements fulfilment, followed by the Ionian Islands, Eastern Macedonia and Thrace, and Western Macedonia. It worths to be mentioned that Attica, Southern Aegean, and Crete, which host over 60% of the Greek population, face significant challenges, underlining the potential impact of strategic interventions in these areas on Greece's overall progress towards the SDGs.

This regional assessment serves as a call to action for local involvement in shaping a more sustainable future and explains the crucial interplay of national ambitions and local efforts towards the realization of the SDGs.

Conclusions and recommendations

While there was considerable progress globally up to 2019, the world remains off-track in achieving the SDGs. At the global level, the key areas of concern include responsible consumption, climate action, and biodiversity conservation. These challenges have been worsened by the COVID-19 pandemic and other global crises, slowing down global progress and development.

The EU has shown progress toward the SDGs; however, challenges remain, especially in addressing inequalities, sustainable consumption, and establishing effective partnerships. The Europe



Figure 3 Status of SDG targets for Greece. Source: Europe Sustainable Development Report 2022

Sustainable Development Report 2022 emphasizes the need for **1.** Prioritizing democratic and inclusive processes, **2.** Reconsidering traditional economic measurement metrics, and **3.** Undertaking tangible actions like forming joint political statements and bolstering stakeholder collaboration.

Greece lags behind the European average in SDG achievement, further compounded by regional discrepancies. To enhance Greece's track toward

the SDGs comprehensive research is essential to determine specific challenges, progress, and opportunities for enhancement.

The successful fulfillment of SDGs requires a collaborative effort, spanning from top-tier EU commitments to regional and local efforts. The SDGs aim for a fair, green, and resilient world, therefore meeting these goals means that we get a future we can all be proud of.

Capture the registered Initiatives developed in Greece



The **SUSTAINABILITY OBSERVATORY** developed by QualityNet Foundation is a recording and monitoring mechanism which gathers the initiatives that are developed in Greece and their connection with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), as an effort to systematically record the level of maturity of the SDGs in Greece, but also to operate as a cooperation platform and a network of exchanging knowledge and good practices.

It is developing in the tripartite **Economy - Environment - Society** recording the initiatives developed in Greece **by the Business & Governmental Bodies, the Businesses, the Local Authorities, the Civil Society and the School Community**. It presents the general level of initiatives that are being developed in our country under the framework of Sustainable Development. Each recorded initiative is linked to one of the 17SDGs, thus allowing systematic mapping, connecting all recorded initiatives with the Sustainable Development issues.

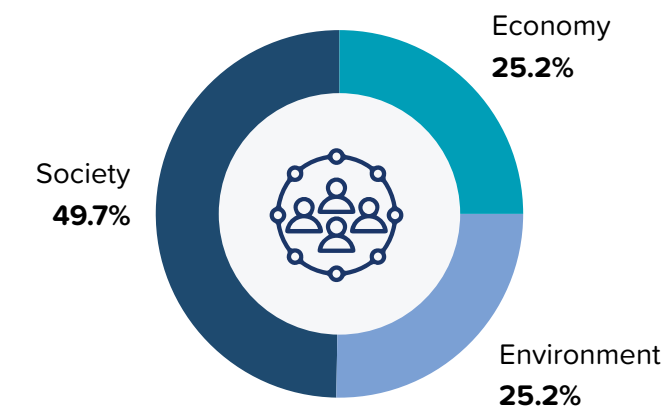
Participants are invited to voluntarily register their initiatives, practices or commitments that accelerate the implementation of the SDGs on the platform by recording detailed information about each initiative, including details of implementation, beneficiaries, timeframe, and evaluation.

The scientific processing of the records in the **SUSTAINABILITY OBSERVATORY** is carried out by QualityNet's scientific team on an annual basis, aiming at creating an Annual Report presenting the trends and the resulting analysis. The Annual Report is delivered to Institutional Bodies with the aim of being, on the one hand, a tool to capture the general level at which our country is in the process of transforming its production model in terms of Sustainable Development, and on the other hand, a tool to support Public Policies.

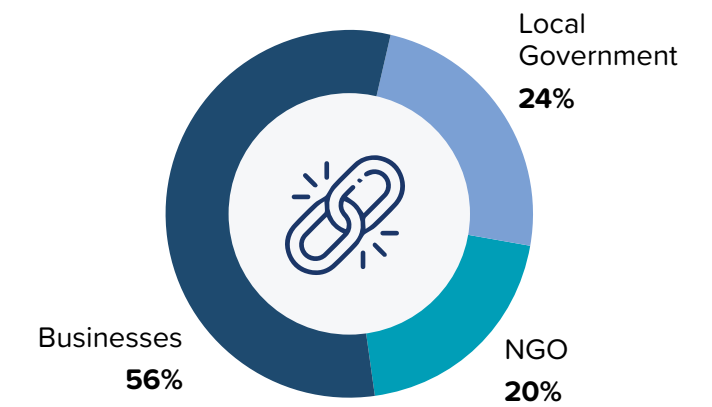
Analysis of the registered data

From the analysis of the data submitted by the **699 Organizations (Bodies- Associations- Businesses - Regions - Municipalities - Civil Society)**, with the **1,370 initiatives in the period 2018 - 2022**, it can be seen the ever-increasing tendency of the participation of Organizations which develop initiatives that contribute to creating a sustainable future. The majority of Initiatives are part of the Society Pillar (49,7%), which could be explained by the challenges that existed in maintaining social cohesion in the years 2018 – 2021, covered in this Report. The Environment Pillar gathers 25.2% while the Economy Pillar gathers 25.1% of the total initiatives.

Total Participation Rates per Pillar



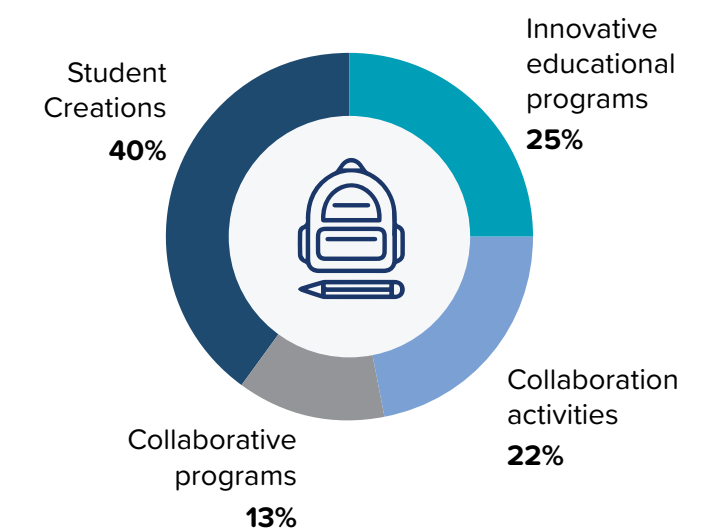
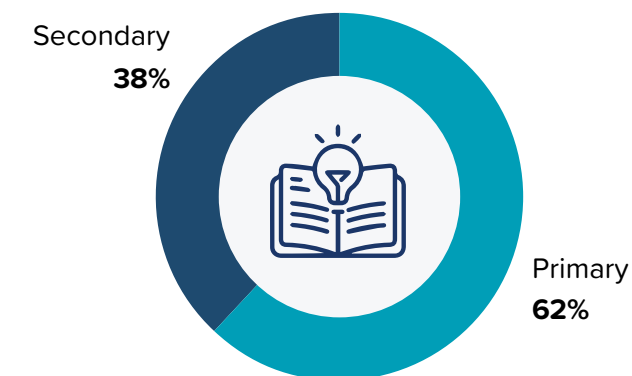
Overall Engagement Rates by Audience



Regarding the distribution of Initiatives by Audience, **Businesses & Professional Bodies participate with 788 initiatives (56%), Local Government with 288 initiatives (24%) and NGOs with 294 initiatives (20%).**

The recording of the Academia is not considered representative and for this reason is not presented in this Report. In contrast, the School Community, at primary and secondary level, is a very dynamic group, having recorded over 2,500 educational approaches to the SDGs, 62% of which come from primary and 38% from secondary education all over Greece; thus, children give a dynamic present as Active Citizens of Tomorrow.

Overall Schools Participation



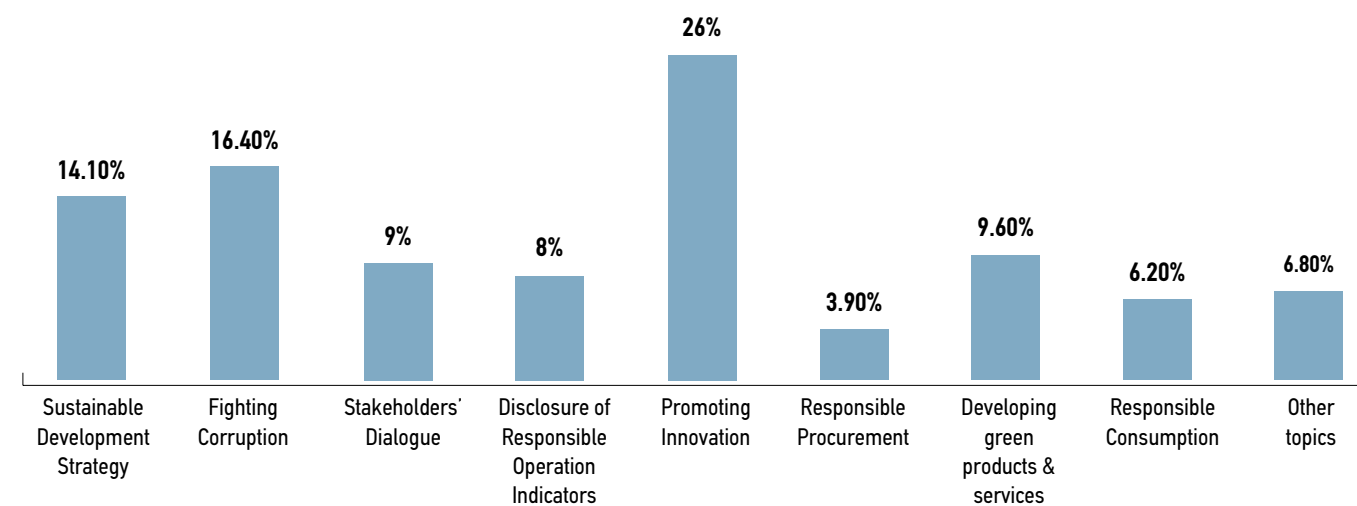
Registered Initiatives by the audience

In the analysis of the total participation of Organizations, Businesses (of large size, with an ever-increasing presence of small-medium enterprises, which show a strong mobilization in recent years) are percentage-wise superior to Local Government and NGOs. This is explained by the fact that Businesses were prior invited to register their initiatives, via the Bravo Sustainability Dialogue & Awards initiative already known to the business public, and thus, they were more accustomed to participating in its innovative evolution, which was the development of a national social dialogue based on the initiatives developed by the participating Organizations.

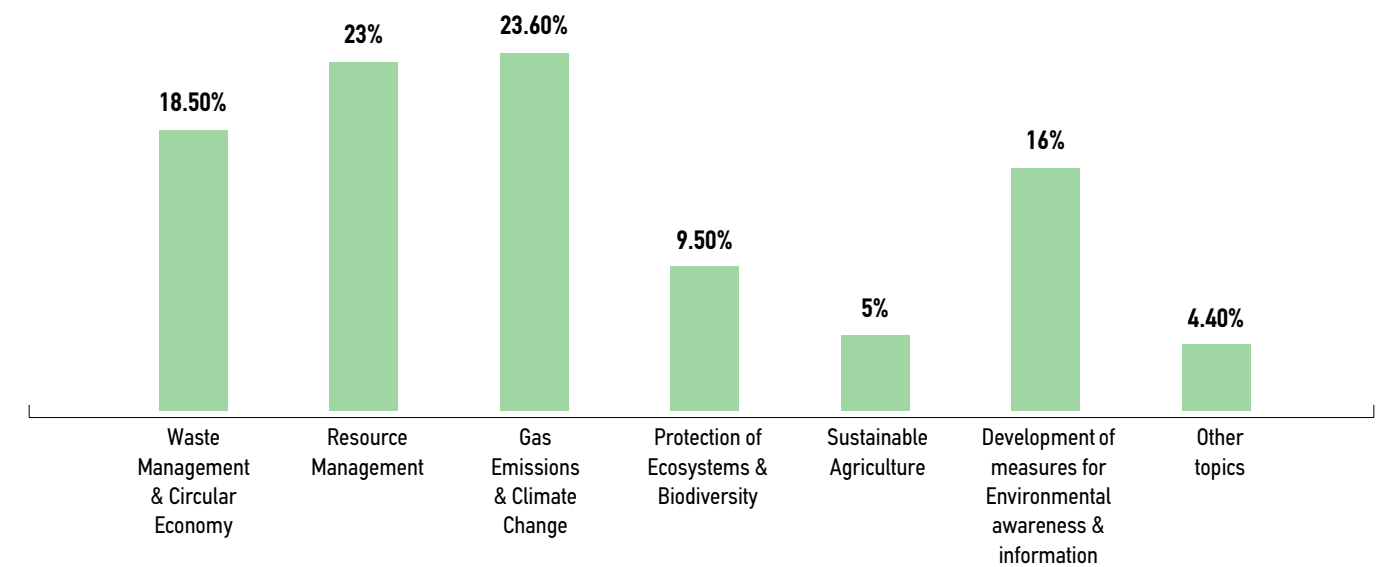
BUSINESSES

In particular, from the analysis of the **Business initiatives**, it appears that particular emphasis is placed on the MARKET Pillar, on the issues of promoting Innovation, Fighting Corruption and developing a Sustainable Development Strategy. While in the ENVIRONMENT Pillar, the dominant initiatives have to do with Resource Management, Greenhouse Gas Emissions and Addressing Climate Change as well as Waste Management & Circular Economy. Finally, in the SOCIETY Pillar, businesses developed initiatives related to Improving the Quality of Life, Lifelong Learning and developing Health & Safety Programs.

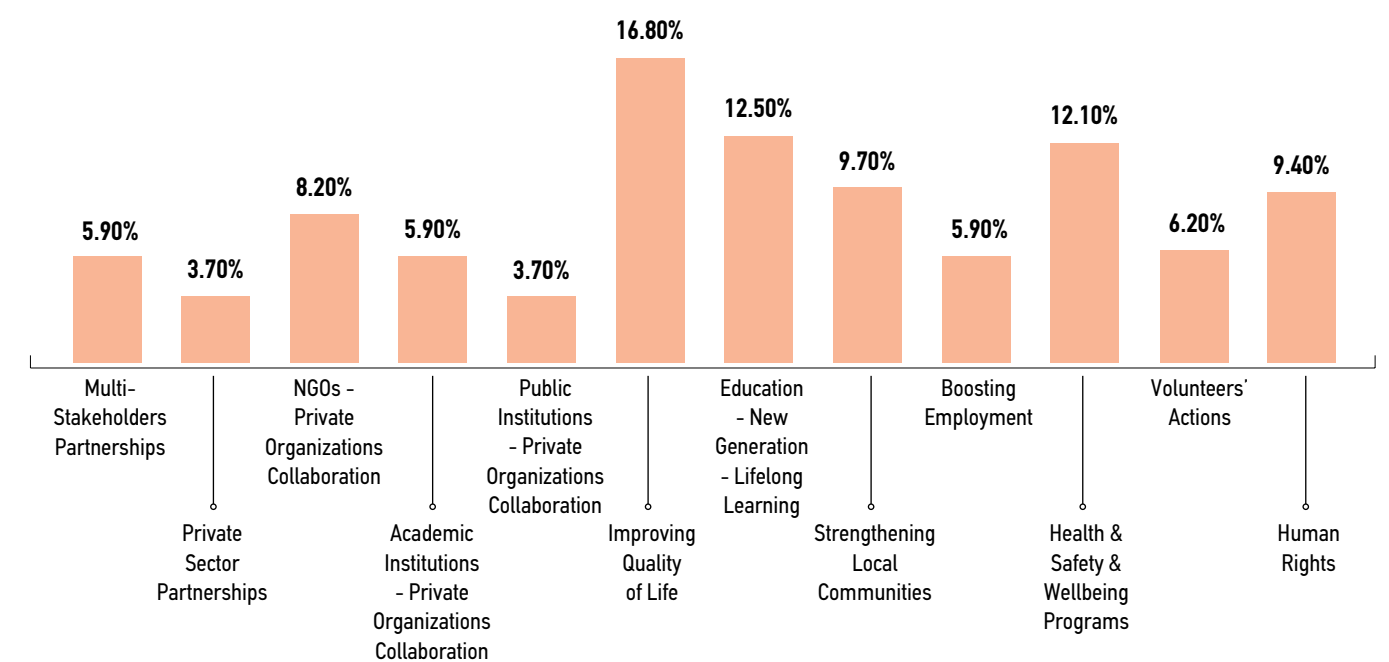
Participation rates of BUSINESS initiatives in the Market Pillar



Participation rates of BUSINESS initiatives in the Environment Pillar



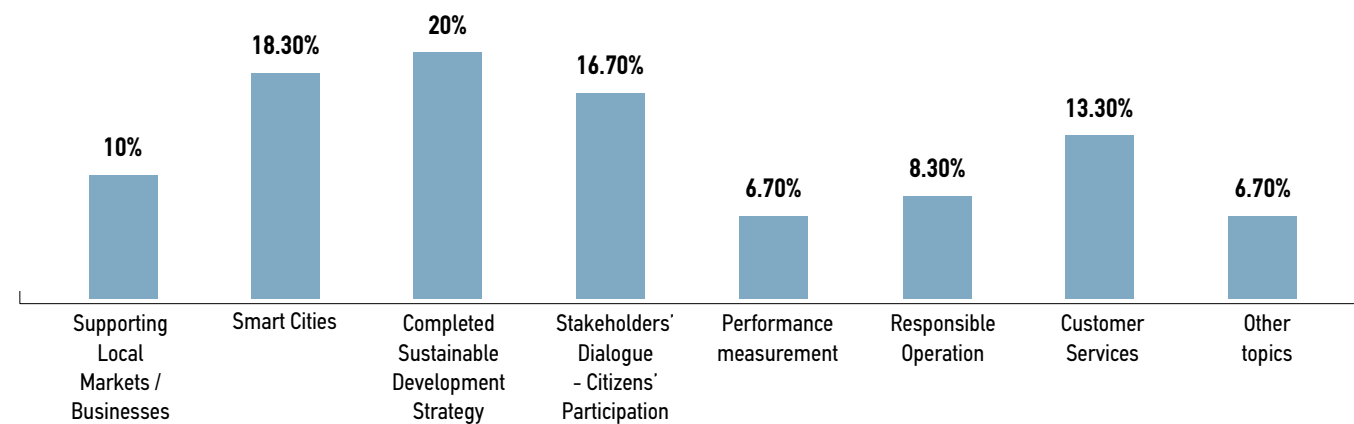
Participation rates of BUSINESS initiatives in the Society Pillar



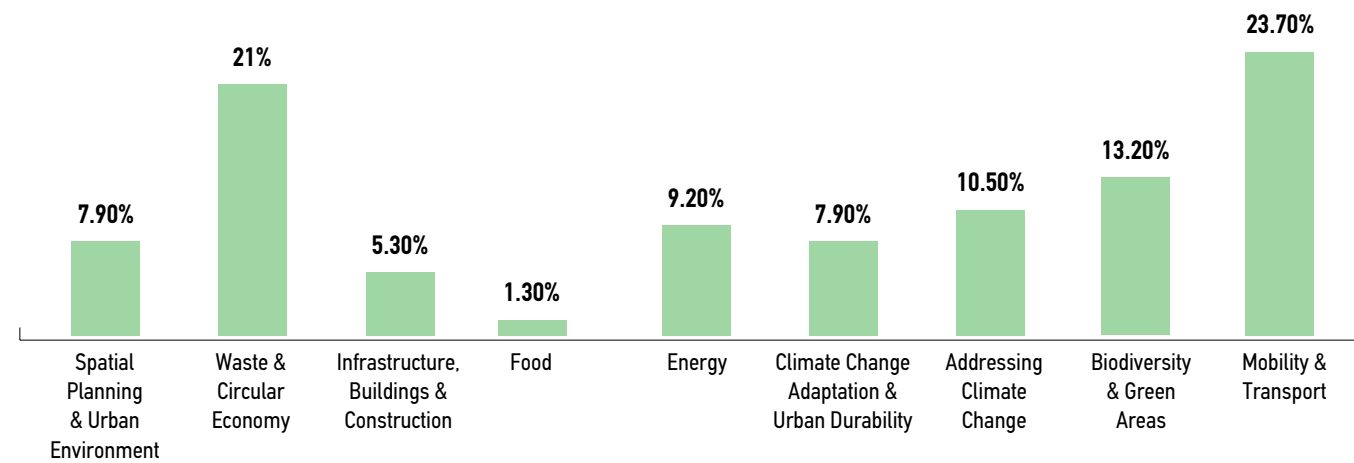

Accordingly, from the analysis of the **Local Government initiatives**, it appears that the Municipalities and Regions place particular emphasis on the MARKET Pillar with Smart Cities, with initiatives for the development of electronic services for their citizens, the elaboration of Sustainable Development Strategy and the Stakeholders' Dialogue. In the pillar of ENVIRONMENT, the themes that dominate the initiatives are Sustainable Urban Mobility & Sustainable Transport programs, Waste & Circular Economy, Protection of Biodiversity and Developing Green Areas. Finally, the SOCIETY Pillar is dominated by the initiatives that have to do with the support of Social Inclusion & Equal Access, Culture & Cultural Heritage, while the Cooperation Programs with Third Parties have a particularly important percentage role.

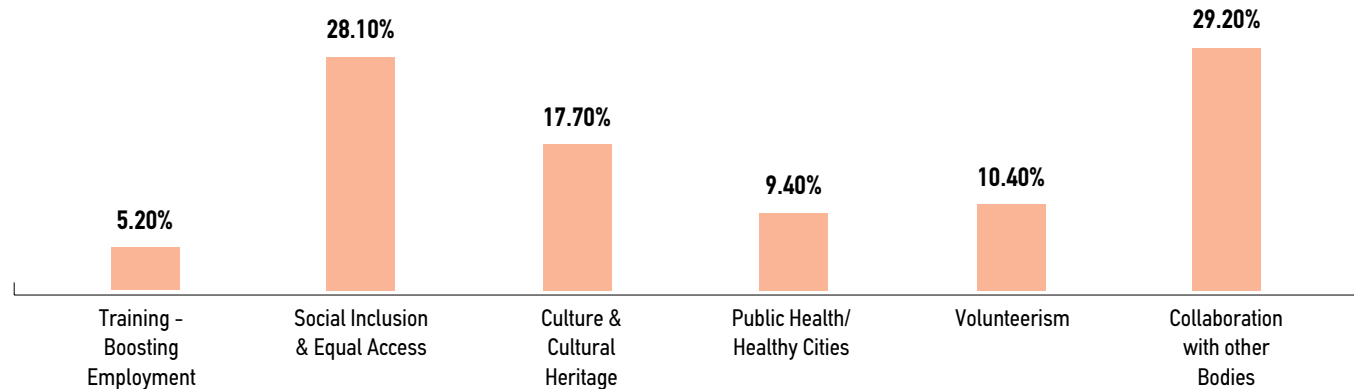
Participation rates of Local Government initiatives in the Market Pillar



Participation rates of Local Government initiatives in the Environment Pillar



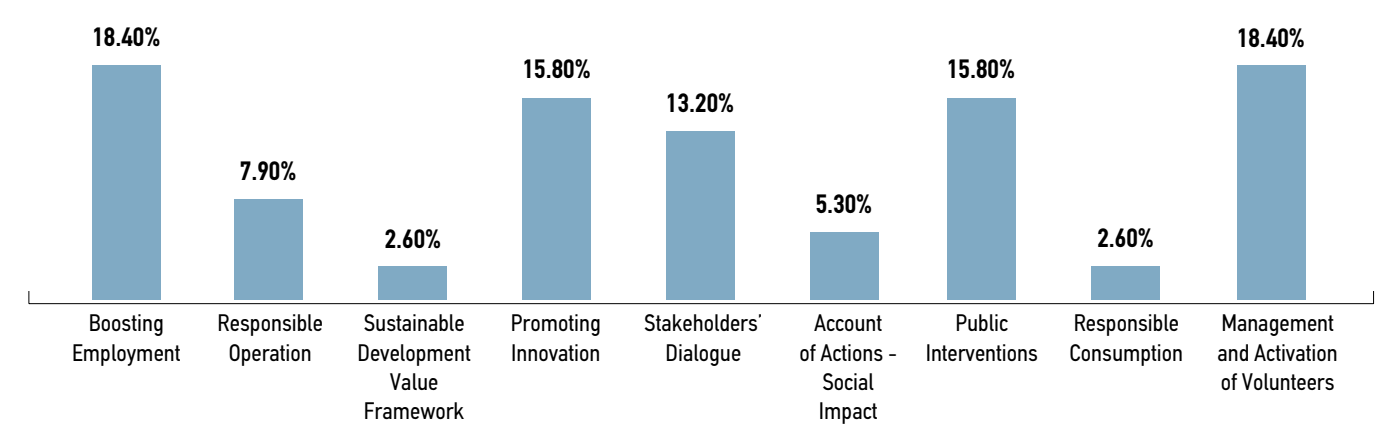
Participation rates of Local Government initiatives in the Society Pillar



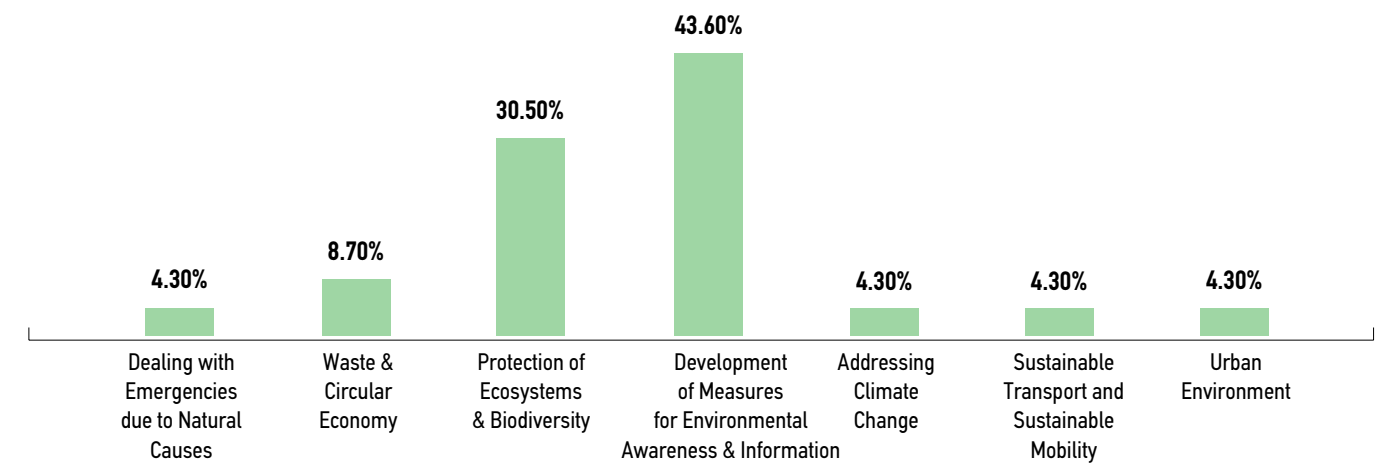

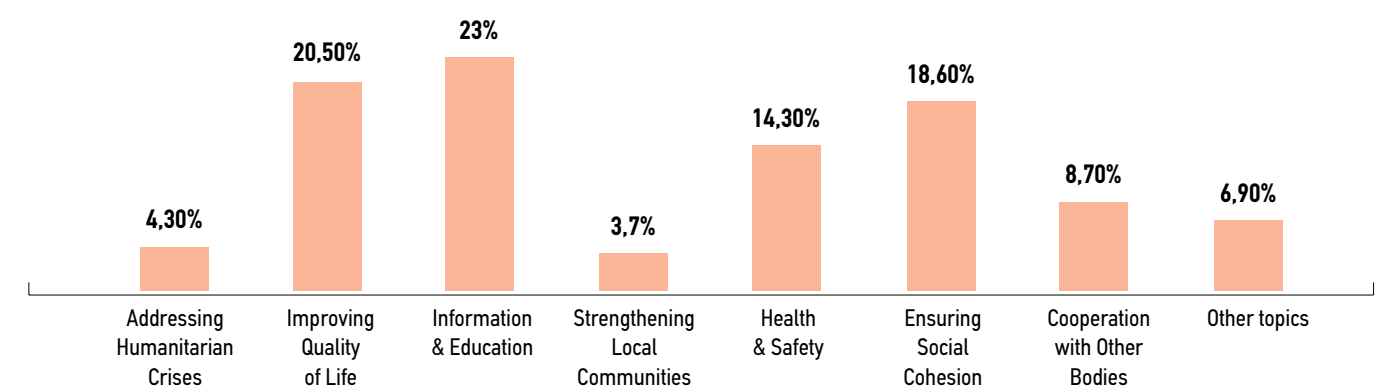
Participation rates of NGO initiatives in the Market Pillar

Participation rates of NGO initiatives in the Society Pillar

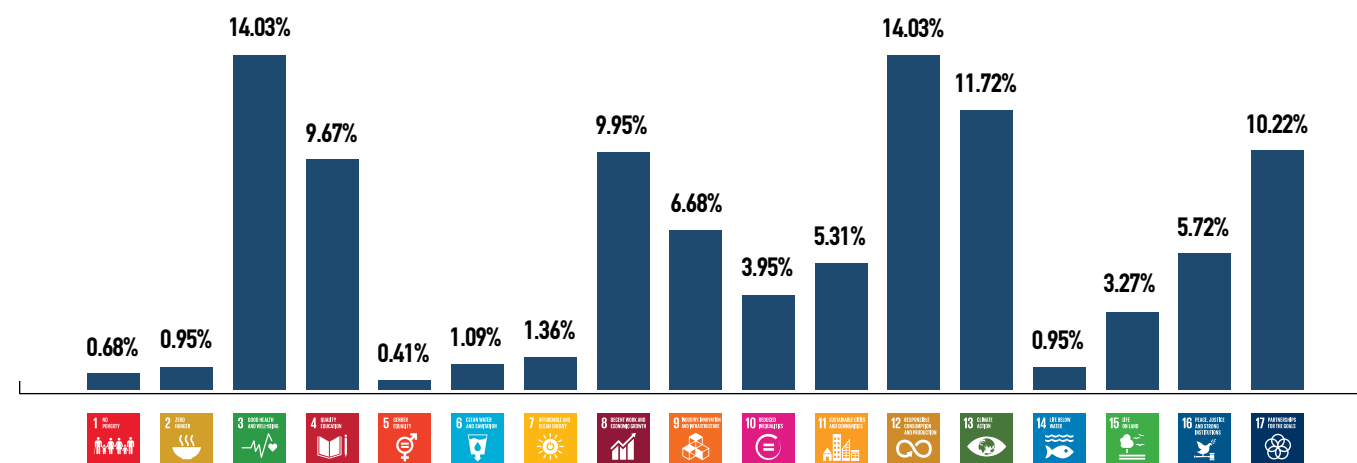




Registered initiatives per SDG

As far as the prioritization of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals is concerned, as this results from the majority of the recorded initiatives, we see that at a national level the SDGs to which the Organizations (Organizations, Businesses, Local Government and Civil Society) are committed and develop more initiatives are **the SDG 3. Good Health and Well-Being, followed by the SDG 11. Sustainable Cities and Communities and SDG 4. Quality Education**. The SDGs that also attract the attention of Responsible Organizations are SDG 12. Responsible Consumption and Production, SDG 17. Partnership for the Goals, SDG 13. Climate Action and SDG 8. Decent Work and Economic Growth. In contrast, the Goals with the least approach are SDG 5. Gender Equality, SDG 6. Clean Water and Sanitation and SDG 14. Life Below Water.

Percentages of registered Initiatives per SDG by Businesses - Local Government - NGOs for the period 2018 - 2022

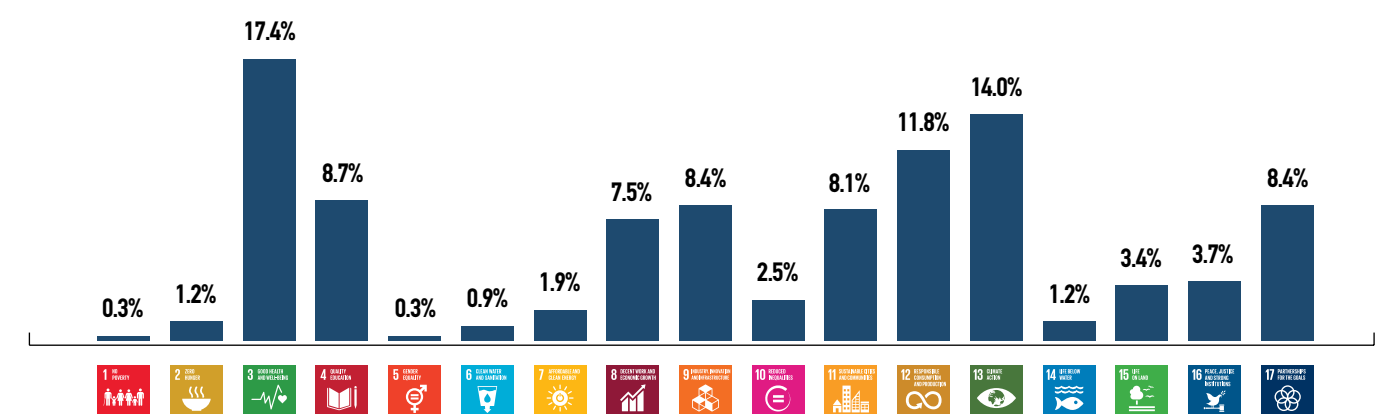
Trends by Audience

BUSINESSES

Businesses in our country have as their priority and most participation Goal 3-Good Health and Well-being with a percentage of 17.4%, followed by Goal 13-Climate Action with a participation rate of 14.0%. Goal 12-Responsible Consumption and Production gathers 11.8%, highlighting the leading role that enterprises can play in production in terms of sustainability. It is followed by Goal 4-Quality Education with a percentage of 8.7% and Goal 9-Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure with 8.4% as enterprises in our country lead in industrial activity.

The Goals with very low participation rates are 6-Clean Water and Sanitation (0.9%), 1-No Poverty (0.3%) and 5-Gender Equality (0.3%).

Percentages of the recorded initiatives by Businesses per SDG, in the SUSTAINABILITY OBSERVATORY for the period 2018-2022.

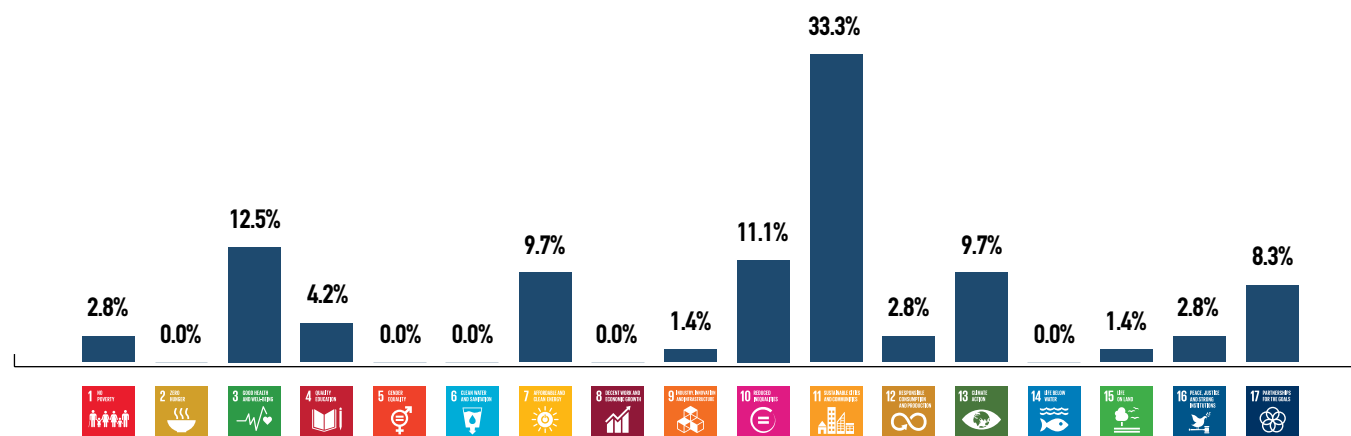


LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

For the Local Government Organizations, the Goal with a particularly high percentage of participations is the 11-Sustainable Cities and Communities (33.3%), as it is expected that the Municipal or Regional Authority emphasizes on the sustainability and quality of life of citizens and the local community in general. Next is Goal 3-Good Health and Well-being with a percentage of 12.5% as it is a given that without a level of health quality of life cannot be achieved. This was most understood through the 2 years of the pandemic, during which local authorities were called upon to manage a variety of public and social challenges. Next is Goal 10-Reduced Inequalities (11.1%). Local authorities focus on reducing inequalities as a social phenomenon that affects vulnerable population groups and any social group or individual that differs.

SDGs 2-Zero Hunger, 5-Gender Equality, 6-Clean Water and Sanitation, 8-Decent Work and Economic Growth and 14-Life Below Water cumulatively have a negligible participation rate of less than 0.5%.

LOCAL GOVERNMENTS - Percentage of Initiatives per SDG, 2018-2022



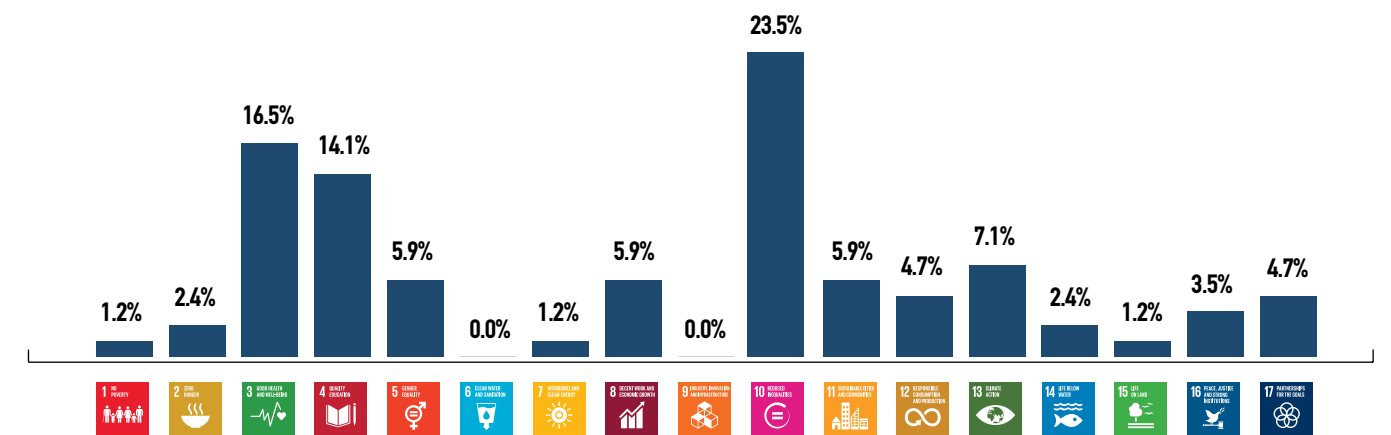
Percentages of the recorded initiatives by Local Governments per SDG, in the SUSTAINABILITY OBSERVATORY for the period 2018-2022

CIVIL SOCIETY

As far as Civil Society Organizations (NGOs) are concerned, the main priority in the development of their actions and initiatives is the reduction of social inequalities, which is why Goal 10-Reduced Inequalities gathers a participation rate of 23.5%, followed by Goal 3-Good Health and Well-being with a percentage of 16.5%, which can be explained again due to the pandemic, where social and health needs increased along with the challenges NGOs had to manage.

The Goals without participations are 6-Clean Water and Sanitation and 9-Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure.

CIVIL SOCIETY - Percentages of Initiatives per SDG, 2018-2022

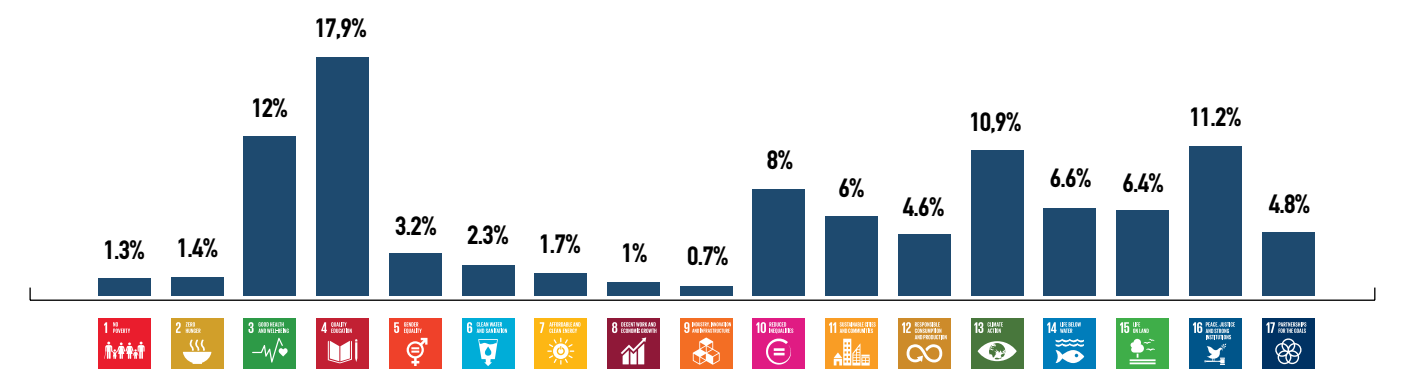


Percentages of the recorded initiatives by the Civil Society per SDG, in the SUSTAINABILITY OBSERVATORY for the period 2018-2022

School Community & coverage rates of the 17 UN SDGs

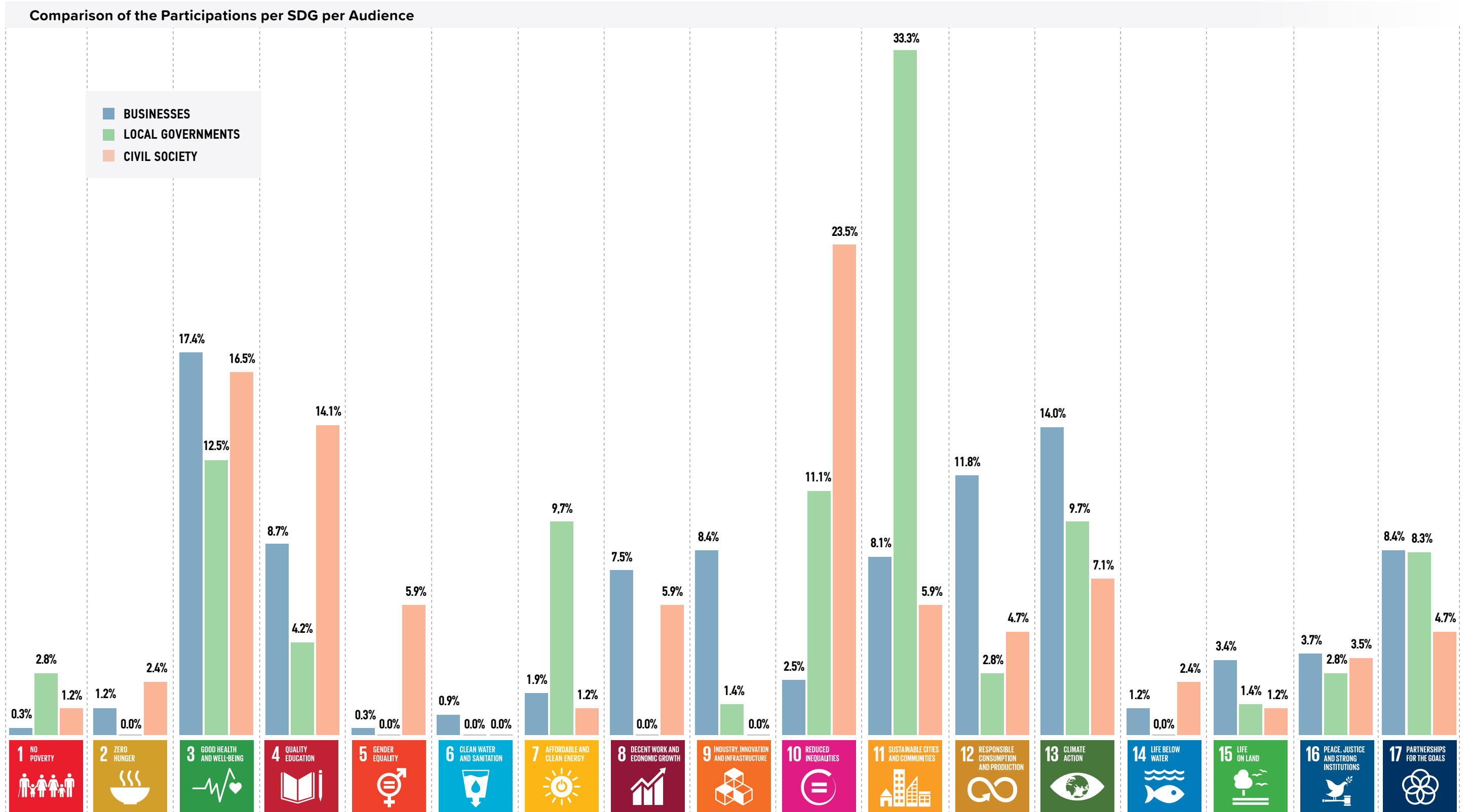


Percentages of the recorded initiatives per SDG by the School Community for the period 2018-2022

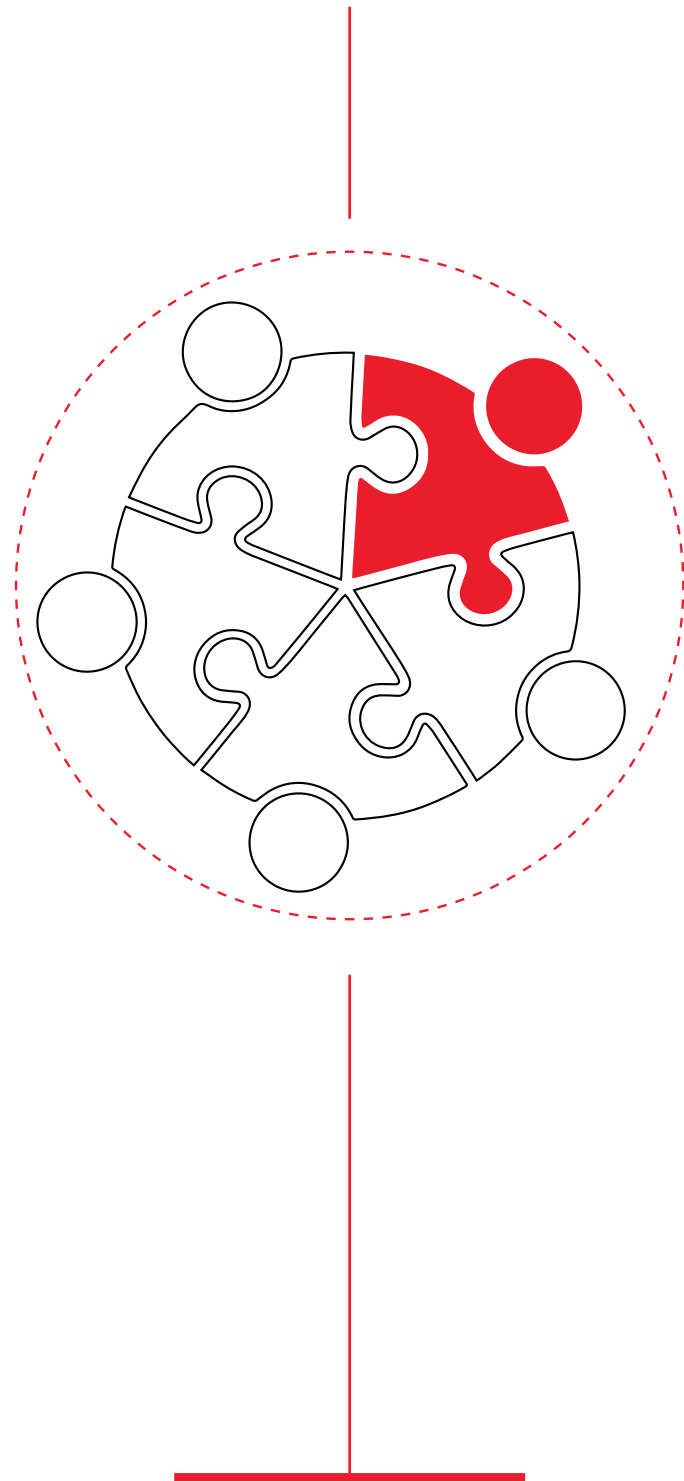

Fighting against poverty

● **Solidarity meals to vulnerable groups**

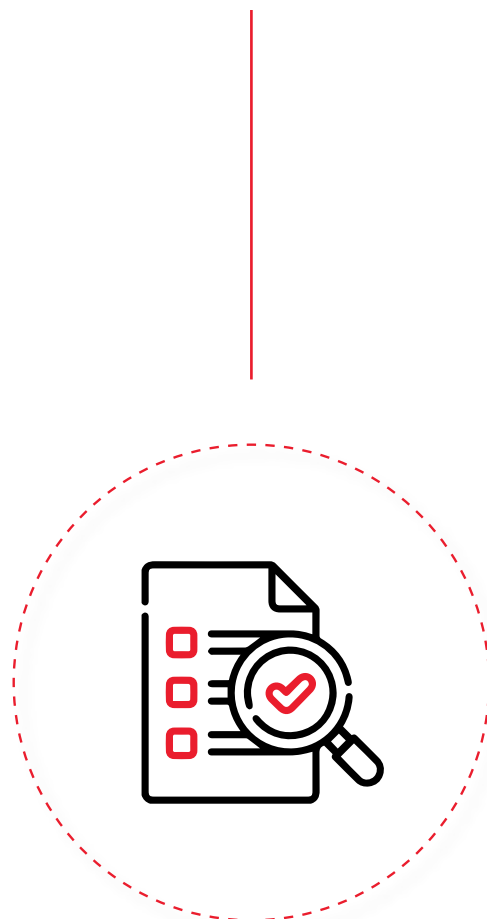
● **The Smile of the Child**

We have been supporting the Organization's cause since 2012 with money and goods donations. In 2015, we granted the Organization a property in Nea Makri to be used as a Child and Family Support Center. Since then, we have been covering all the operating costs of the Centre on a monthly basis. We also provided two trucks to the Organization, which visit Lidl Hellas stores daily to receive products so as to cover the needs of all the "Smile of the Child" shelters in the prefecture of Attica and Northern Greece. In addition, in 2021, we made available a second fully-equipped property in Epanomi to operate as a Child and Family Support Centre.

● **Gathering essentials for those in need together with our customers**

We have placed a collection basket in our stores for people in need. Our customers have embraced this action and have been actively participating. Since September 2018, we have offered over 55,000 supermarket carts to support the Archdiocese's food pantries across Greece.

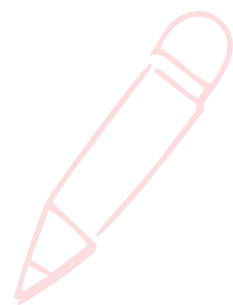

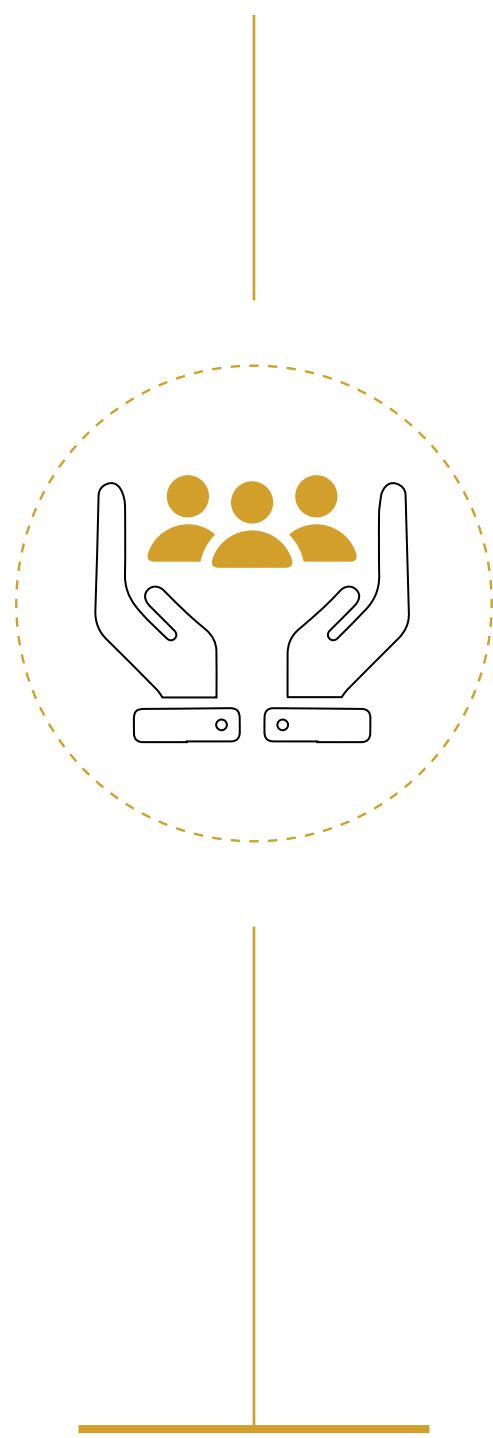

Promotion of good nutrition and the formation of proper eating habits

The Ministry of Rural Development and Food is promoting the consumption of fruit, vegetables, and milk in schools, in an effort to play its part in increasing the share of fruit, vegetables and milk in children's diets, for a proper diet during the stage shaping their eating habits.

In collaboration with the Ministry of Education, Research and Religious Affairs, it created the **European Fruit, Vegetable and Milk Distribution Program**, with the financial support of the European Union. About 800 primary schools of Attica, Thessaloniki, Patras and Heraklion, Crete, have been selected, that is, about 150,000 children will participate.

Per school year will be distributed:

- **Fruits - Vegetables:** 7 to 8 distributions where approximately 1,400 tons of fruits and vegetables will be distributed (apples, pears, oranges, tangerines, peaches/ or nectarines, apricots, cherry tomatoes, and Knossos cucumbers). All products are of the superior quality category I and checked by the services of the Ministry of Rural Development and Food and Regions.
- **Milk:** up to 23 milk deliveries. The milk is pasteurized and will be distributed in a 250ml package portion per student. About 800 tons of milk will be distributed in 3.4 million portions.

It is worth noting that in Greece 84.5% of students consume only 1 fruit daily, 63.8% of students consume only one portion of vegetables daily, while 15% of students do not consume any fruit and 36% do not consume any vegetables daily.

In addition to the distribution of fruits, vegetables and milk in schools and education in healthy eating, the implementation of the program is also based on 2 other pillars:

- **the agriculture and livestock farming,**
- **its promotion with target groups, such as children, parents, and teachers.**

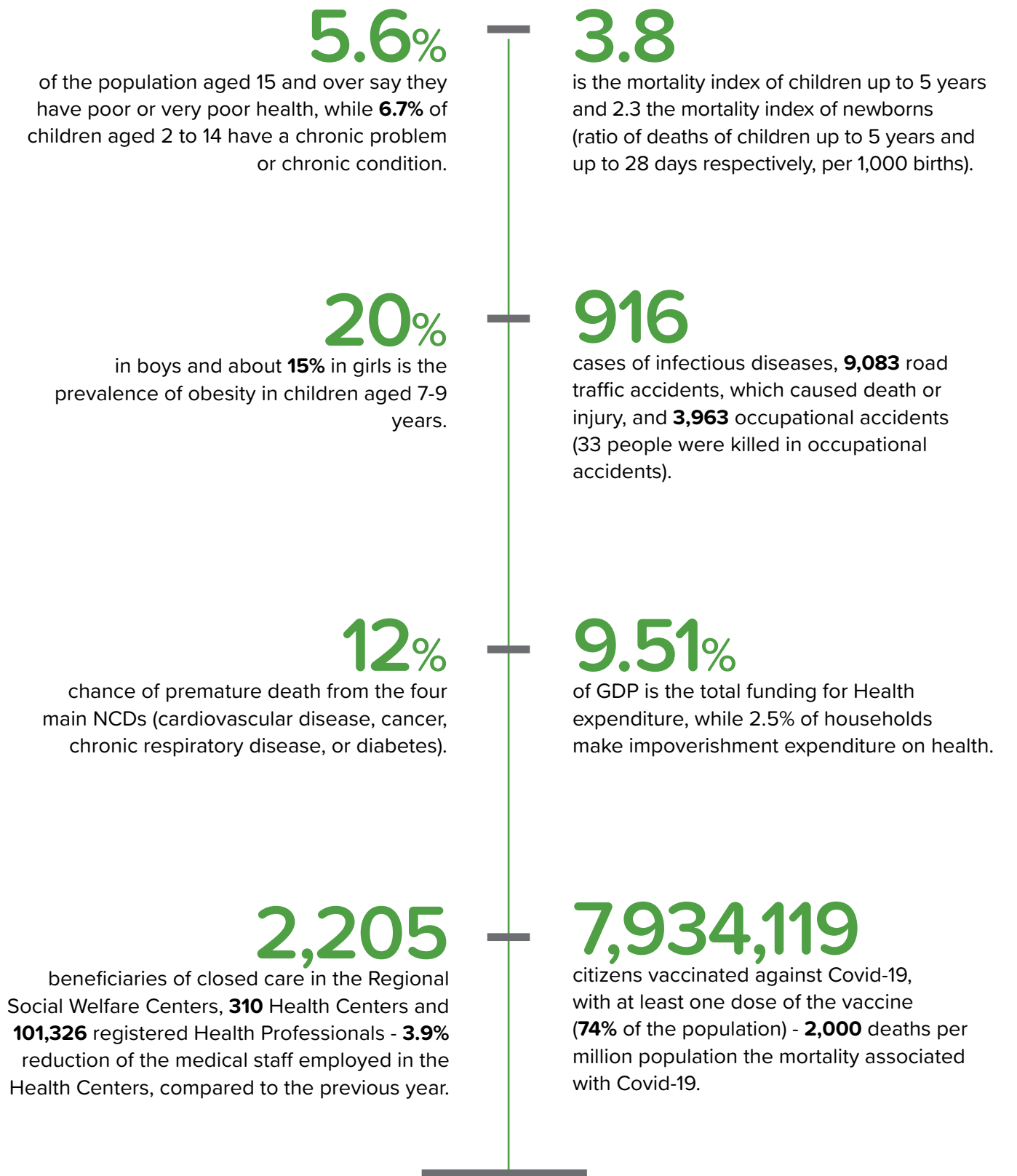
Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all, at all ages

In the wake of the economic crisis, the Greek health system was already facing serious challenges. The situation worsened tremendously when state agencies had to battle the Covid-19 pandemic. Compared to other European countries, public health spending in Greece has been relatively low, due to the economic crisis during the previous decade, especially in long-term care. Despite this, there have been significant investments and institutional reforms in the primary health sector, while access to complementary services is a priority. It is clear that the national health system needs further organizational reforms to ensure its resilience, starting with more efficient prevention, and more accessible primary care. The pandemic also exposed weaknesses in the mental health system that required both ad hoc and long-term solutions. In addition, insular and remote areas face chronic difficulties in accessing health services, such as medical personnel and specialized laboratory centers.

● Patients

Serving patients with an integrated mechanism for medical care, primary health services, and ensuring the health of the population. Family Doctor. Organized vaccinations by the National Health System.

● Vulnerable Groups

The National Vaccination Program targets specific susceptible and vulnerable groups of the population, minors and adults, immigrant populations and populations at risk.

● Elderly

Health care services are provided in all hospitals of the country and for all citizens. Family Doctor & Home Care. Public Elderly Care Structures.

● Children

National Childhood Cancer Registry: registration of minor patients and data collected from various sources gradually feed into a mechanism for assessing the demand for health services and provide scientific staff with the necessary information for the management and follow-up of specific patients throughout the country.

● Mothers & Pregnant Women

Prenatal screening and breastfeeding action awareness campaigns in health care facilities and other places where breastfeeding can be encouraged, institutional interventions in health facilities and workplaces for breastfeeding working mothers.

● Employees

National Action Plan for Public Health, which includes the "Spyros Doxiadis" National Prevention Program. The Program focuses on the prevention of behavioral factors such as tobacco use and poor dietary habits associated with the mortality rate, as well as early detection and effective prevention of diseases. Extensive screening program, which focuses on early detection of common NCDs in the general population. Home Prevention Program. Psychological Support Lines.

● Vulnerable Social Groups

Providing financial solutions and prioritizing the care of people living in poverty and social exclusion.

● Residents of Remote Areas

Regarding access to public health services by residents of remote areas and small islands, particularly in emergencies, patient airlift services to city hospitals are provided by both the National Health System and the military. Air medical evacuation flights across the country and abroad are carried out by the Ministry of Defense & the Ministry of Health.

● Doctors & Nursing Staff / Hospitals, Clinics & Laboratory Centers

In order to address the increased hospitalization needs exacerbated during the Covid-19 pandemic, the total number of available public Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds was significantly increased, from 565 public ICU beds in Greece, without availability for possible hospitalization of COVID-19 cases, to 1,343 functional ICU beds, of which 704 were dedicated to COVID-19 patients in 2022.

● State & State Bodies (NHS)

In 2020, a five-year National Action Plan for Public Health was introduced, which includes the "Spyros Doxiadis" National Prevention Program, while the National Childhood Cancer Registry was also established / Approval of a new National Strategic Plan for Road Safety 2021-2030, which introduces the Safe System approach and the long-term vision of zero road accidents.

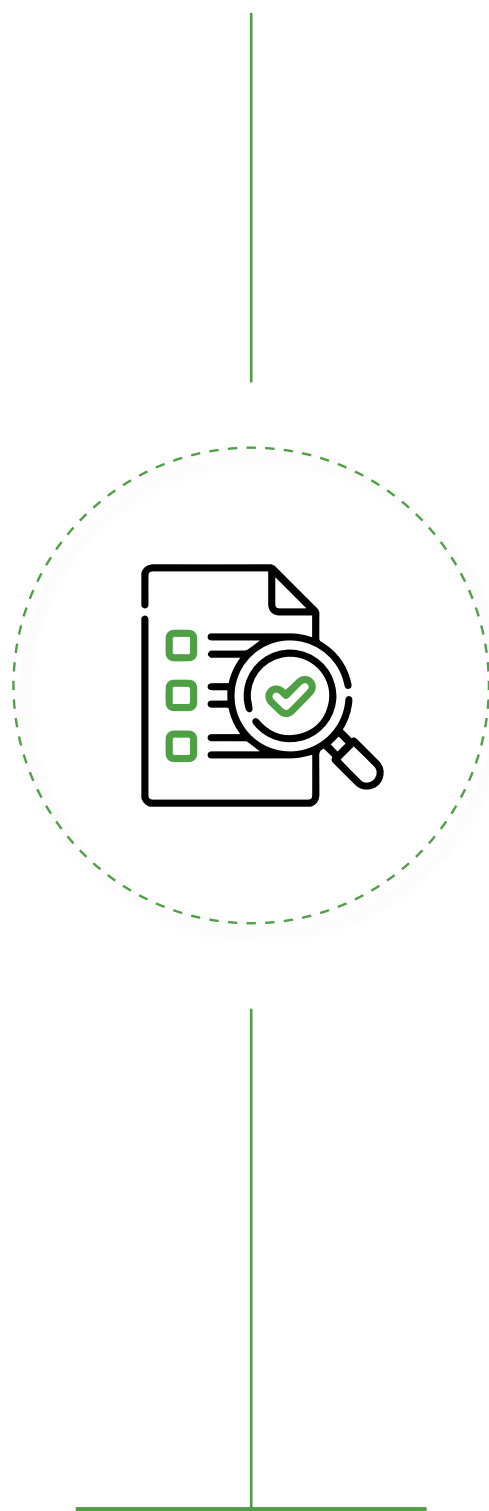

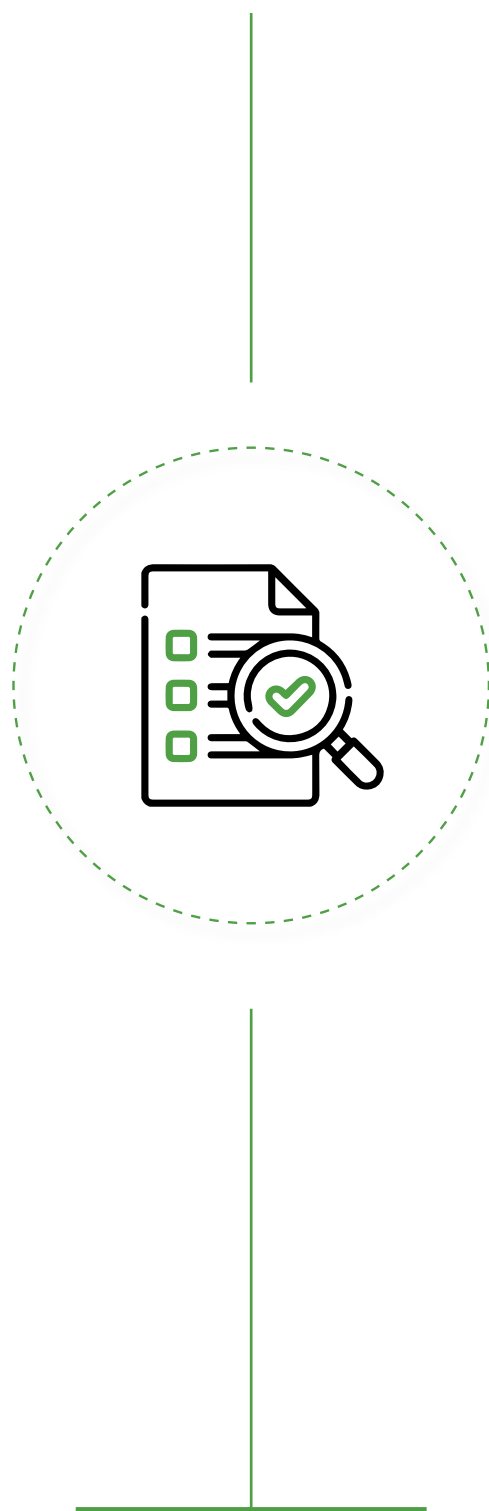

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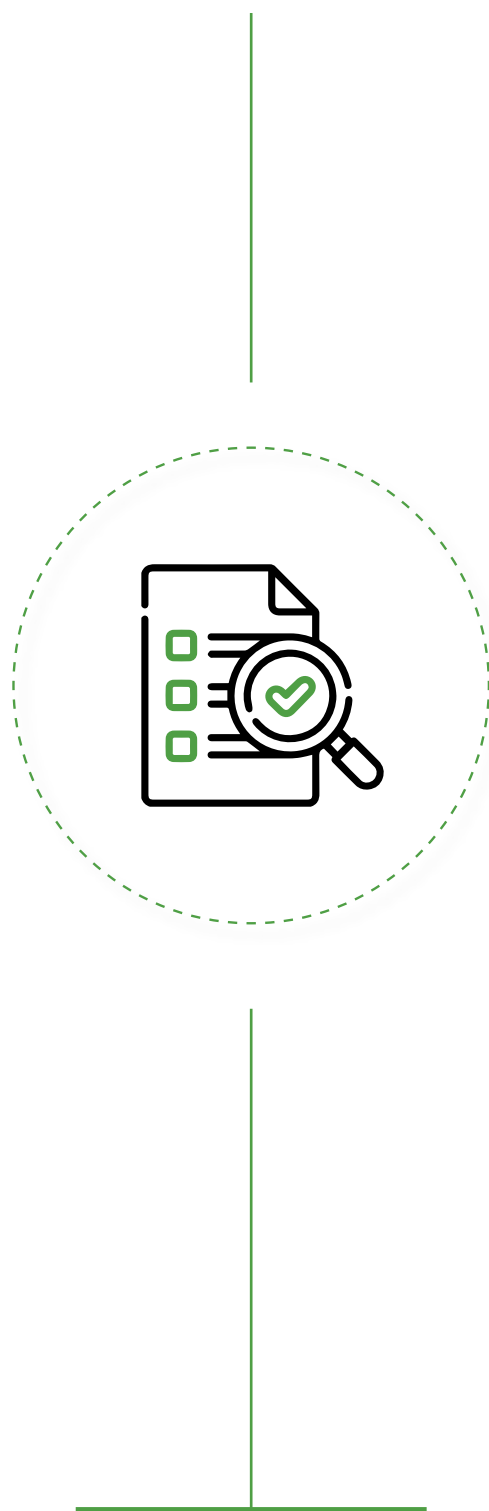

In a country with high youth unemployment rates, the Greek government's initiatives for quality education at all levels are important and focus on soft skills, as well as digital and other skills, in order to better prepare the new generations for a job market for all, without exclusions. Tackling social inequalities through education remains a major challenge, as does retaining bright young minds in our country, motivating them to live and work here. At the same time, it is also a challenge to provide equal educational opportunities to men and women, both in basic and general education, as well as in their professional training and development.



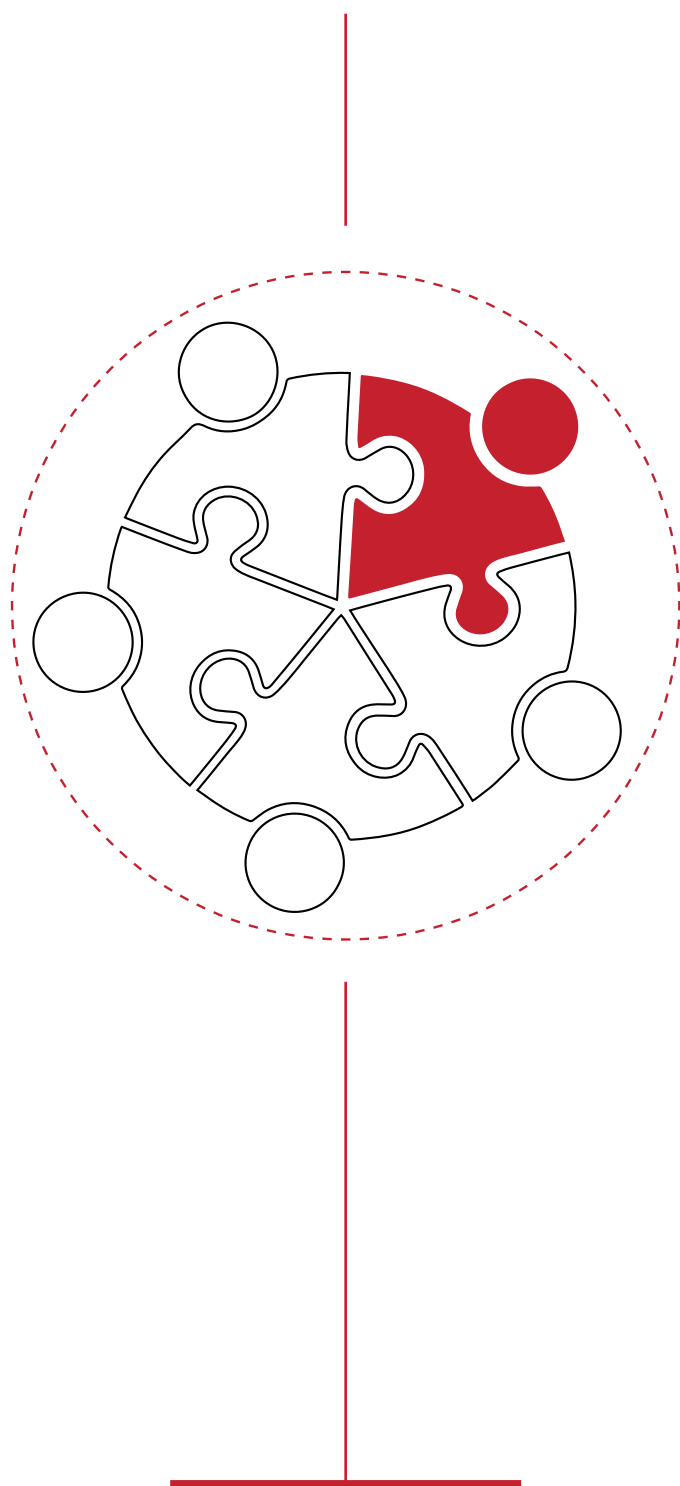

What are the main challenges they face?

Insufficient pre-school development, social exclusion, limited access to education for certain groups, lack of soft skills and digital skills development programs, need for vocational guidance, need for remedial teaching.

Lack of connection between education and professional rehabilitation, mismatch of qualifications and needs of the labor market, difficulties in accessing higher education, need for technical and professional skills for employment and entrepreneurship, need for knowledge and training on human rights and sustainability issues, high unemployment rates.

Inequalities in access to all levels of education and training, gender discrimination in education and the working environment, family obligations, motherhood.

Inequalities in access to all levels of education and vocational training, including for people with disabilities, indigenous peoples, and children in a vulnerable situation, need for adopting special teaching methods, limited qualified teaching staff and carers.

Increased needs for specialization of teaching staff, integration of staff in borderland and areas with living difficulties, non-competitive salaries, and incentives.

Need to build and upgrade educational facilities that will meet the needs of children and people with disabilities, limited scholarships, older technology laboratory equipment in schools and universities, need to transfer responsibilities to school units, need to adopt special education pedagogies, encouragement of innovative educational practices

Limited employee education and training programs and seminars (vocational training), high training costs for employees, unskilled staff.

Limited number of scholarships and funding for excellence, insufficient participation of stakeholders in the design of education systems, lack of promotional tools and communication campaigns for education, modernization of the education system and curriculum.

Access to education at all levels for all, remedial teaching, home teaching for unaccompanied children living in shelters.

● Adults / Youth / Students

Development of technical and professional skills, soft & digital skills for employment, competitiveness, decent work and entrepreneurship, reduction of unemployment rates.

● Women / Girls

Free, equal, and quality access to education for all women.

● Vulnerable Social Groups

Adoption of differentiated teaching pedagogies to meet the special needs of students, encouragement of innovative educational practices, National Lifelong Learning Program to further improve education, placing particular emphasis on apprenticeships for people with disabilities and/or special educational needs, National Action Plan (ESA) for People with Disabilities, recruitment of 4,500 special education teachers as permanent staff, new online platform for persons with disabilities "prosvasis.oaed.gr".

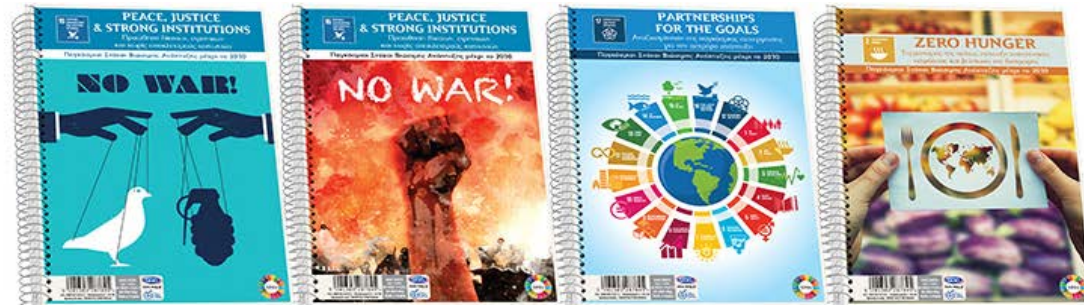
Incorporation of training programs into the CSR strategy, development of partnerships, synergies and funding of training programs, participation in the Ergonomic Workspace Arrangement Program for hiring people with disabilities and ensuring their easy access to the workplace.

● State & State Agencies

New National Law on Education and National Action Plan (NAP), supplementary classes for children living in hostels for unaccompanied minors, more reception centers and institutions, inclusion of refugee and migrant children in formal education through partnerships, supply of technological equipment to schools and upgrading of digital infrastructure and connectivity, implementation of projects financed by the Recovery and Resiliency Fund for the further equipment of schools, vouchers for pupils and students to purchase technological equipment, based on socio-economic criteria, evaluation of the educational work carried out by school units, expansion of the Network of Model and Experimental School Units, merit-based distribution of available resources (funding), the National Digital Academy Platform by the Ministry of Digital Governance, operational regulation of the Oaed and collaborations with internationally renowned online education providers, Skills Workshops in schools.

What are the main challenges they face?

- Femicide, domestic violence, sexual harassment, gender-based abuse, under-representation in decision-making bodies and in management positions, trafficking.
- Incidents of harassment, insufficient incident recording, control, and prevention system.
- Discrimination in the workplace (recruitment, evaluation, promotion process), stereotypes, insufficient state support and assistance system.
- Lack of education, inability to deal with incidents of discrimination, stereotypes.
- Gender pay gap, difference in promotion rate, glass ceiling phenomenon, gender discrimination and harassment in the workplace.
- Discrimination based on gender (recruitment process, evaluation systems, staff benefits & remuneration, human rights).
- Inadequate training of competent authorities and incident management system, non-implementation of institutionalized policies, lack of policies that promote equality.

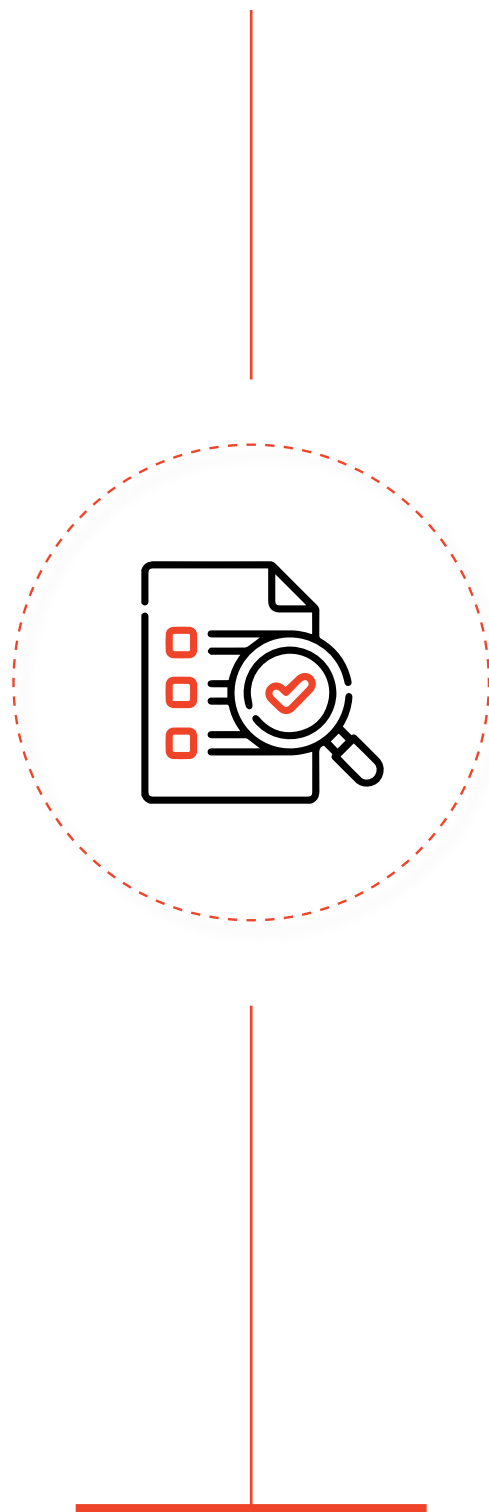

Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

Water is the most significant natural resource, and its protection is a basic priority, with investments in water processing, water infrastructures, managing sewage and in performance of water supply services, as well as in drains, being in the front line in the state's strategy for sustainable development. Moreover, actions such as the reverse of the corrosion of the ground, the prevention of desertification and draught, and the treatment of water shortage respond to the mitigation of the impact of climate change in water resources, and in transition towards a circular economy.

What are the main challenges they face?

Water shortage, bad quality of water, consequences in food security, draught.

Inadequate sanitary facilities, bad quality of drinking water, consequences in the choices of households in poor families, hunger, malnutrition.

Maximum contribution to water pollution through the discharge of liquid effluents, sewage discharge, and the reckless use of water during the production process.

Reckless use of the natural resources and water, exhaustion of natural sources of water, water shortage in arid islands, sea litter, developed tourism and excessive mobility - especially during the summer months.

Pollution of rivers, lakes, seas, oceans, mountains, forests, wetlands and water tables, contamination from sewage and waste, destruction of biodiversity.

Subsidies under the National Plan for Rural Development, incomplete action plan for the rational use of water by households and businesses.

Lack of specialized knowledge, research abilities, scientific partnerships, and planning of preventive measures to save water and manage sewage.

● **Farmers / Producers**

Replanning of water in rural and peripheral level for irrigation and drainage, salinity management, crop and management of farming water, wastewater use and groundwater, sustainable pumping and supply of water, implementation of the National Rural Development Program for the reduction of water loss and the implementation of productive methods of irrigation, improvement of efficiency and water saving on a level of agricultural exploitations.

● **Vulnerable Social Groups & Marginalized Communities**

Implementation of Information System for the annual collection of operational and economical information pertaining to the water service providers, widespread and fair access to economically affordable and of high-quality drinking water for all.

● **Businesses & Industries**

Implementation of contemporary systems of water management and reduction of untreated wastewater, investment and application of circular economy practices during the production process, recycling and safe re-usage of water, minimization of dangerous chemicals and materials, participation in activities and implementation of programs related to water and hygiene.

● **Local Community / Island Population**

Extensive use of desalination for water supply and management on arid islands, integrated management of aquatic resources and waste, promotion of circular economy and of the sustainable and balanced local economic development, sustainable tourism exploitation, participation of local communities in improving the management of water and the sanitation facilities.

● **Water Ecosystems**

Sustainable management, protection and rehabilitation of aquatic ecosystems, River Basin Management Plans (RBMPs) of 14 areas of the country, which cover surface freshwater such as lakes and rivers, underground waters, transitional and coastal waters until the distance of one nautical mile.

● **State & State Agencies**

Taking hygiene measures in Roma camps and other socially excluded communities, financings for the supply of sanitary material and other services, informational activities related to the preventive measures of Covid-19, decontaminations and drinking water, National Operational Plan for Drinking Water, National Water Monitoring Network – Program of Measures for the improvement of the quality of water, completion of urban wastewater management project and implementation of new projects for the upgrade of currently existing infrastructures, legislative framework for the re-usage of recovered water from adequately treated urban sewage.

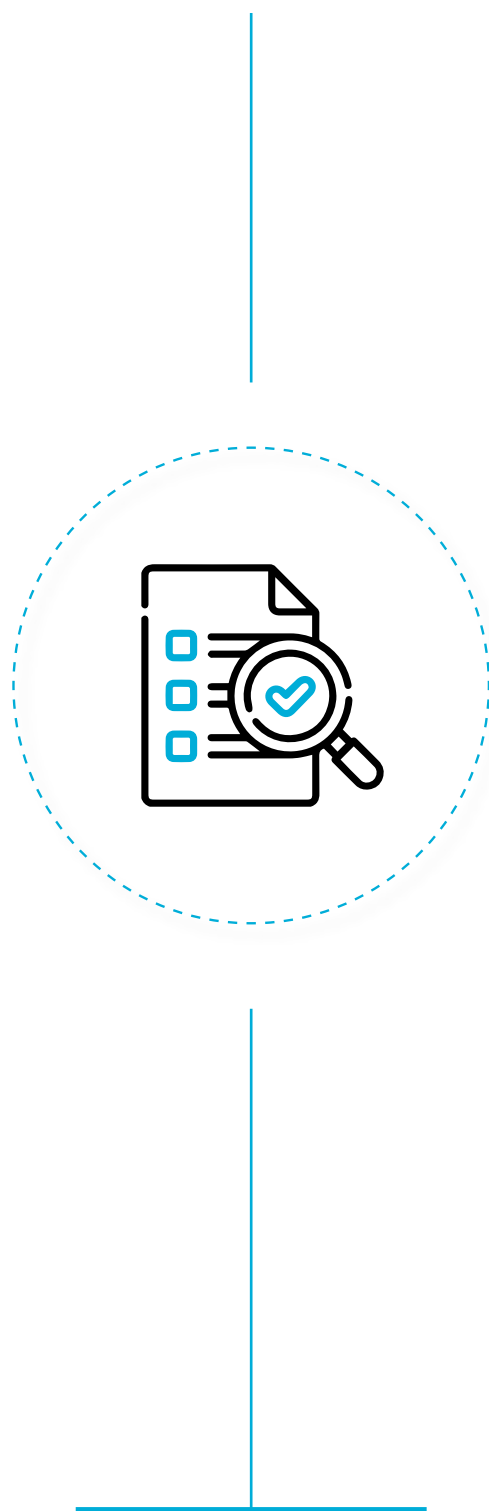

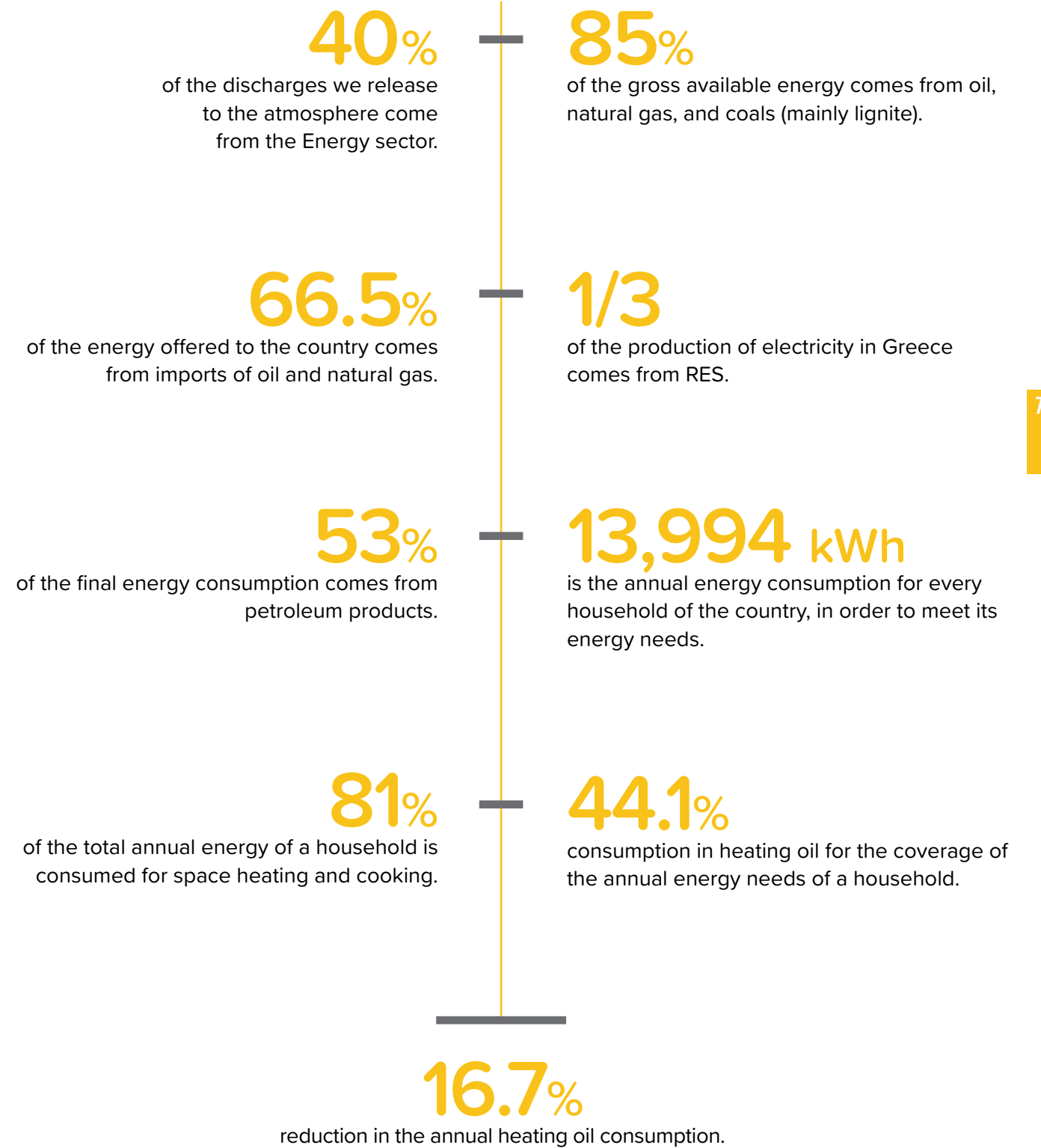
Ensure access to affordable, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy for all

Energy transition to a low carbon model is a challenge and a high priority for Greece. The war in Ukraine, which caused strong fluctuations in energy stability, has come to make the need for a green transition more pressing than ever. With a history of lignite dependence, Greece committed to de-lignitization, with the withdrawal of lignite plants proceeding steadily. Safety in supply change and energy poverty are also within the priorities of the country. In this context, Greece accelerates its efforts to increase the share of RES in the power supply system, in order to reduce prices and to guarantee this safety to the supply chains. The promotion of hybrid energy systems with storage devices can also support the decarbonization of the economy, through the collection of the remaining electric energy from RES. At the same time, significant investments and re-planning are carried out at the infrastructures of power distribution network, in order to become more friendly for the environment and without social exclusions. Sustainable public and private transportation require strong investments in order to improve energy efficiency and to reduce their heavy dependence on oil.

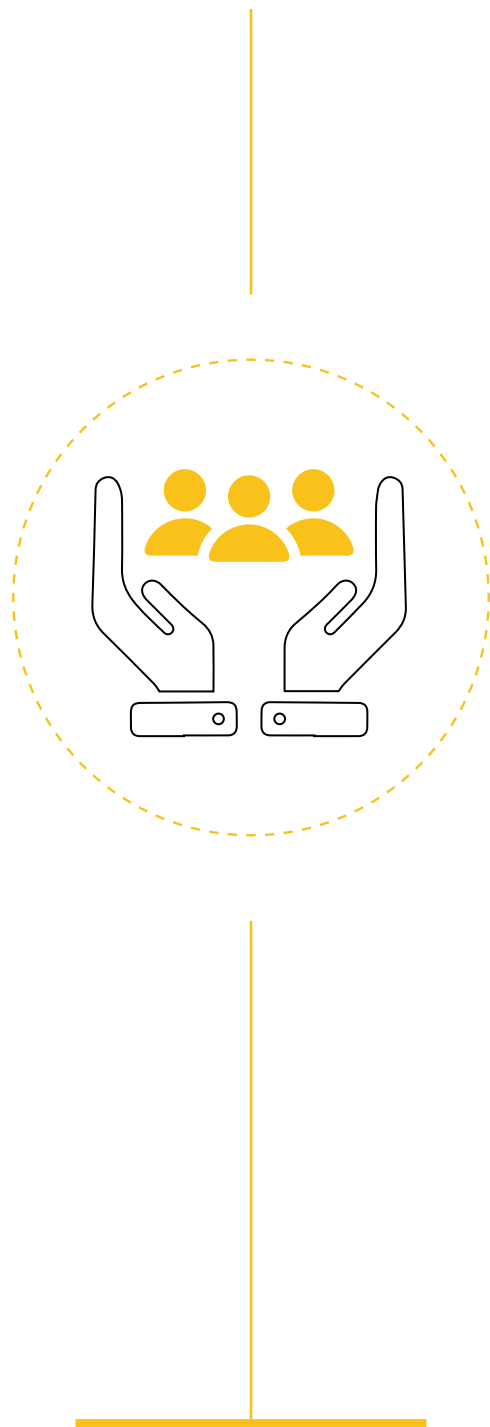

Being fully aligned with the Global Goals for Sustainable Development, and aiming to optimize the energy efficiency of the water supply networks, Municipality of Domokos is significantly limiting the waste of water and energy reserves, from 2021 and until the renewal of the network, with new intelligent systems for monitoring its water supply systems and networks.

Through the remote monitoring of the water network installations, we ensure the proper operation, the optimal service to consumers and the best possible quality of water.

The water supply networks of the Municipality of Domokos are actually a complex system, for which remote monitoring makes it possible to deal with the problems that arise immediately and in time. In this context, the telemonitoring system includes interventions at 41 positions - Local Drilling Control Stations (LDCS) - in the water supply networks for the continuous and real-time counting of the consumed energy and the transfer of data to the Central Control Station (CCS), which receive appropriate processing and evaluation for the planning of the necessary actions.

With [the installation of intelligent energy management and energy saving systems in the water supply networks](#) of the Municipality of Domokos:

- Unhindered public access to safe quality and sufficient quantity of drinking water is achieved.
- Ensuring both personal and domestic hygiene, as the water is found to be free of microorganisms or harmful substances, the concentration of which undermines public health.
- Achieving the optimization of the operating settings and the maximization of the energy efficiency of the equipment, both in design conditions under full load and in partial load conditions.
- The necessary operating time of the related equipment and subsystems of the facilities is minimized through appropriate control systems, according to the water supply demand.
- It provides the possibility of monitoring the water balance, the reduction of hydraulic damages, as well as the possibility of predicting possible failures of the water supply system (leaks, broken pipes), which ensures increased safety in the operation of the water supply network facilities.

Energy Communities



The Regional Authority of the Region of Western Greece (RWG), inspired by "The EU Covenant of Mayors", contributing to strengthen this project and implement the goals of the above agreement by creating the Energy Communities, a cooperation network of Municipalities and the Region. This is the largest virtual energy offsetting project with a photovoltaic park not only in Greece but also in the whole of Europe.

From 2021, the **7 energy communities of Western Greece** are the partners of the photovoltaic park in the Pilot Polder estate in the area of Messolonghi, with an area of 1,300 acres, forming the great "energy alliance" to deal with the unprecedented energy crisis of our days, drawing the new avenues of development in the wider region guided by and based on energy, and ensure a healthy and sustainable future for the region, aiming to:

- ▶ annual cost reductions of electricity consumed which will result from the installation of the photovoltaic plant
- ▶ liberating farmers from the unbearable energy burden they currently suffer
- ▶ relief from the unaffordable energy costs for Municipalities, Municipal Enterprise for Water Supply and Sewerage and Public Entities of the Region of Western Greece, bringing them an indirect financial benefit, through the reduction of billed energy
- ▶ relief from past debts for Local Vascular Improvement Organizations
- ▶ reduction of the environmental footprint of the electricity consumption of the Regional Bodies of Western Greece.

For this "green project" more than **60 bodies** managed to cooperate, trust each other and ultimately through this create value and influence more than **306,000 residents** from **11 Municipalities**, **139,000 professional farmers** and their families.

This project is not at all easy, but it is a creative move by the people of the self-government who decided to take their destinies into their own hands, creating a huge political legacy from which society itself will benefit.

The initiative of the Region of Western Greece for the establishment of Energy Communities was awarded as the **best initiative for Energy and the Environment in the Local Government** and as one of the best in the country, during the "BRAVO SUSTAINABILITY DIALOGUES & AWARDS 2022".





Our Vision and Action: Energy Self-Sufficiency

Climate change imposes challenges that must be holistically addressed. The **Municipality of Fyli**, marching along the axis of the EU environmental goals, transforms its weak points and highlights its environmental sensitivity by organizing an inclusive action plan with three main axes: i) Energy Self-sufficiency, ii) Hydrological Self-sufficiency and iii) the "Twin Transition" Plan. The Energy Self-sufficiency of the Fyli Municipality constitutes a pillar including cross-cutting projects with environmental and social dimensions.

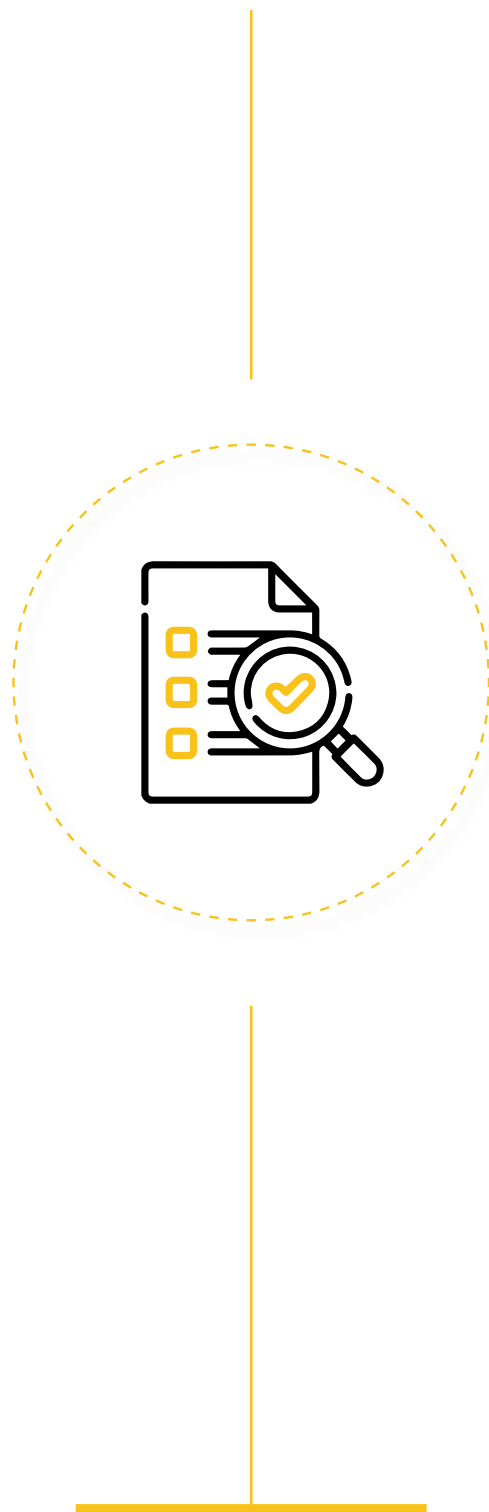
Approaching problems strategically, our municipality managed to successfully overcome them by introducing innovative projects such as implementing the Landfill Reform project. The purpose of the reform is the area's aesthetic, energy-related and functional upgrading. The establishment of an Environmental Park as well as a Renewable Energy Park (RES) with the respective installation of Solar PVs is already underway, aiming at providing free electricity to vulnerable households. Solar PVs, in combination with the existing biogas energy production unit, comprise a larger unit of renewable energy source - an energy park, contributing to the energy autonomy of the municipality.

At the same time, our Municipality is working to achieve its environmental vision, proceeding with energy upgrading of schools and other municipal buildings. The total energy upgrade was delivered through interventions concerning thermal facades, thermal insulation upgrades, cooling system upgrades, window and door frames with specific permeability coefficients, installation of LED lighting fixtures, devices for automated control of the heating system operation with digital compensation units and installation of photovoltaic systems.

In 2021, we created the Phaethon Energy Community. The energy community was established in order to promote a social and solidarity economy, innovation in the energy sector, tackle energy poverty, and promote energy sustainability. Municipality's vision for sustainable development is complemented by its hydrological independence. Overall interventions are foreseen to reduce the Municipality's environmental footprint and energy costs improving citizens' living conditions and support a sustainability-based culture.



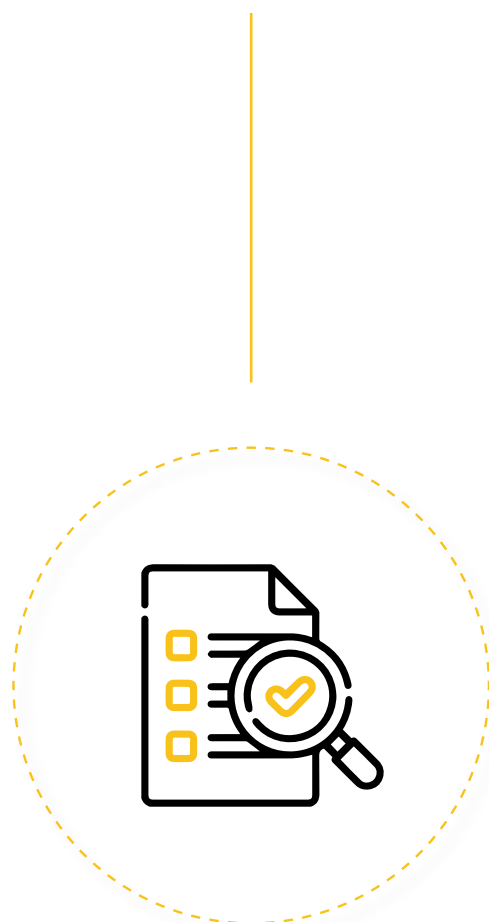

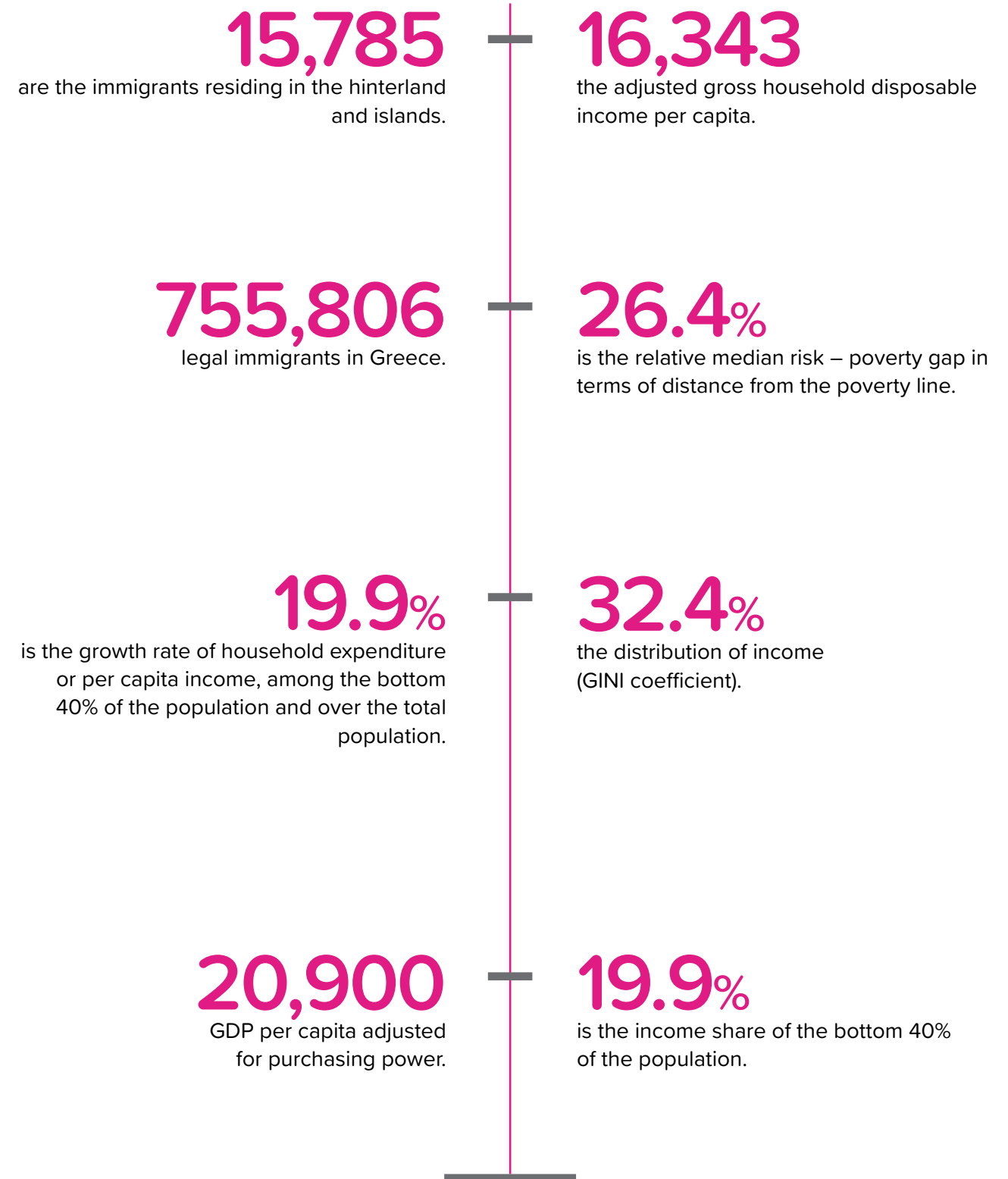
Reduce inequality within and among countries

The international community has taken significant steps to lift people out of poverty. However, inequality persists with large differences in access to health and education services, and other goods. The belief that economic development is not sufficient to reduce poverty and inequalities is increasingly cultivated if it is not inclusive and does not include the three dimensions of sustainable development: economic, social, and environmental. Active population integration policies are necessary, especially in a country that has been receiving mass immigration for decades, to ensure decent living conditions for all without inequalities.

What are the main challenges they face?

- Poverty, reduced access to health services and education, large income gap between citizens, successive waves of mass immigration, multi-level social exclusion of the Roma, discriminations.
- Chronic lack of policies, accessibility and infrastructure issues, institutionalization, delays in services, bureaucracy and complicated procedures, stereotypes, barriers to independent living.
- Inequalities, sexual orientation and gender identity discrimination, racism, stereotypes, lack of institutional provisions, systemic dysfunctions that relegate them to second-class citizens, social exclusion.
- Human trafficking, inequalities and discriminations in the workplace, glass-ceiling phenomenon, sexual harassment at work, curruption, and care of third parties.
- Lack of protection and growth of children, long-standing inequalities in the quality and quantity of childcare services, delayed diagnosis of learning disorders, burdensome and outdated health system, inadequate institutional care.
- Unequal remuneration and benefits, human rights infringement in the workplace.
- Absence of anti-discrimination policies, human rights protection and remunerations and benefits, lack of grievance mechanisms for reporting incidents of discrimination.
- “Accessibility gap” related to distance and the insularity faced by islanders, higher prices of goods and services transferred to the islands, increasing the cost of living in the island territories.
- Economic crisis, bureaucracy, economic and social effects, missing framework for Human Rights, insufficient institutional framework.

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● Vulnerable Social Groups

Progressive increase in the income of the population, social inclusion regardless of age, gender, disability, race, ethnicity, origin and religion, access of marginalized groups to education, employment and healthcare, faster acquisition of Greek citizenship, restructuring of the naturalization process, online public access to information, development of effective immigration policies, reduction of transaction costs for migrant remittances, social integration programs for migrants, integration of ex-addicts and young offenders into the labor market, Roma branches in municipal Community Centers and social integration.

● People with Disabilities

Disability Card for benefits for everyone from every institution, implementation of 9 financial assistance programs for people with disabilities, increasing subsidies and participation in the labor market.

● LGBT+ Community

National Strategy for LGBTQ+ Community (2021) to visit healthcare services, communication with the police and public management, adaptation to work environments and transition to education.

● Women & Mothers

Access for all women to employment programs, inclusion of victims of violence, accessibility to the labor market for human trafficking victims.

● Young People & Children

Strategy for social inclusion and the fight against poverty – National Plan for the Protection of Children’s Rights (2021), mentors acting as role models for unaccompanied children – reception, accommodation, education, smooth transition of children into adulthood and their integration into the labor market.

● Employees

Enhanced representation of women in decision-making and on Board of Directors, addressing the Pay Gap between men – women, fair wages, and benefits in the working environment.

● Businesses & NGO

Recruitment policies based on social criteria, equal opportunities, unbiased evaluation and social protection, diversity awareness programs within organizations to reduce inequalities between gender, ethnicity and sexual orientation in the labor market, Assisted Living Homes.

● Local Community

Accessibility of islanders to basic goods and to free public services, implementation of the Transport Equivalent for all islanders and cargo to equalize the transport costs of islanders, improve of mobility.

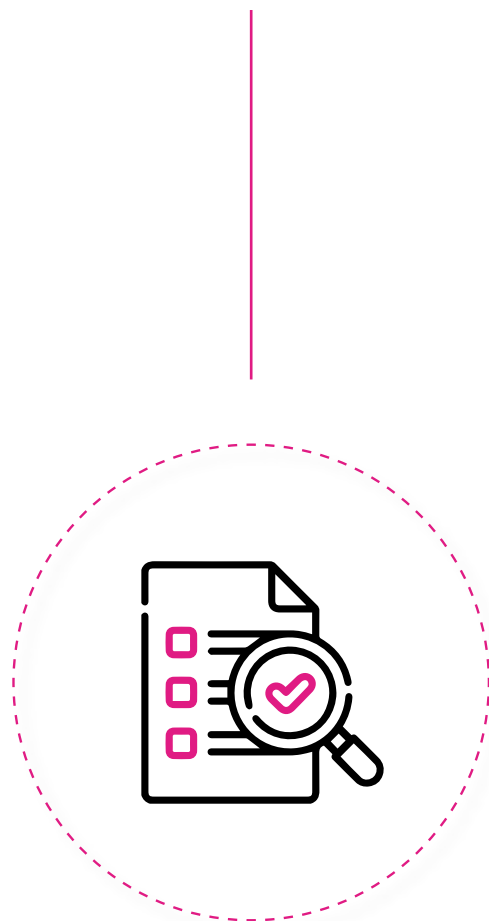

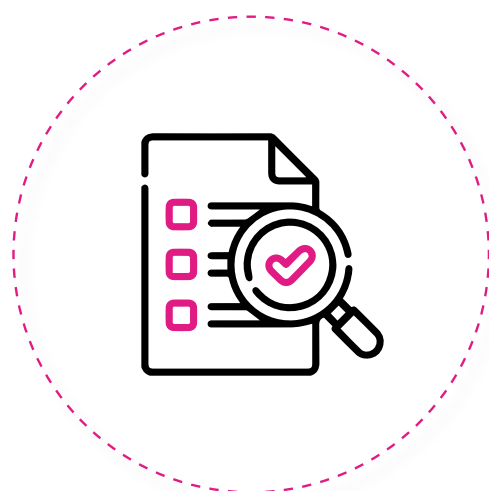

What are the main challenges they face?

Inequalities in income and opportunities, car accidents, urbanization, overcrowded households, noise, exhaust gas and pollution, land abuse and waste of resources, traffic jam, contamination, energy poverty, economic crisis, bad quality of life, housing and cohabitation problems, Covid-19 pandemic.

Homelessness, poverty, reduced incomes and opportunities, difficulty in accessibility in infrastructures for people with disability, social exclusion, increased number of unaccompanied minors and children, social exclusion.

Earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, floods, winter storms, hazardous material transport accidents, inadequate response of the country to natural disasters.

Increased risk at work for traffic police, public transport drivers, firefighters, civil protection workers etc., deaths, accidents, inadequate pay and benefits, understaffing.

Lack of funds for the provision of basic services, lack of adequate housing and the degradation of infrastructure.

Need for sustainable transport and accessibility for all, including disabled people, reduced transport, bureaucracy, inconvenience and poor citizen service, citizens' need for green infrastructure, pressures in urban centers, minimal green public spaces, barriers to island connectivity and the availability of high-speed broadband connection for services.

Environmental degradation, habitat fragmentation, loss of ecosystem services.

Lack of funds for the provision of basic services, infrastructures degradation, mass immigration waves.

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● **Citizens**

Access to adequate, safe, affordable housing and basic services, slum upgrading, providing safe and sustainable transport systems for all, improving road safety – expanding public transport, improving the environmental footprint of cities.

● **Vulnerable Social Groups**

Provision of accessible transport systems for women, children, people with disabilities and elderly, without exclusions and sustainable urbanization, universal access to safe, without exclusions, and accessible green and public spaces, pilot temporary relocation of 56 Roma families to social housing, subsidies on tickets on public and private (long-distance) transport for students, people with disability, citizens aged 65 years old+ and unemployed.

● **Victims of Natural Disasters**

Significant reduction in the number of deaths and those affected by natural disasters, investment in prevention, better coordination of actions and distribution of responsibilities through the country's National Comprehensive Emergency Plan «Xenokratis».

● **Public / Municipal Employees**

Implementation of Health & Safety policy, protection measures, providing incentives, competitive remuneration and benefits, recognition and awards, flexible working hours, leave provision.

● **Social Structures / NGOs**

Protecting children's rights through partnerships, a mechanism for rapid identification of unaccompanied children who are homeless or live in precarious situations, providing of safe accommodation and support.

● **Local Government & Local Society**

Promoting sustainable lifestyles in the city and community, promoting sustainable mobility, promoting alternative means of transport, hiking, biking, and public transport – construction of additional road infrastructures, simplification of local urban plans, implementation of Regional & Maritime Spatial Frameworks, implementation of Local & Special Urban Plans, increase in the number of sustainable cities and human settlements, construction of sustainable and resistant buildings with the use of local materials, «Urban Accessibility Plans» of Municipalities, use of medical planes and medical equipment for local community health emergencies.

● **Cultural & Natural Environment**

Protection and safeguarding of the world's cultural and natural heritage, Archaeological Cadastre – an integrated information system for systemic recording, documentation, digitalization and management of archaeological sites and cultural heritage.

● **State & Regulatory Bodies**

Development of economic, social, and environmental links between urban, and rural areas, regulatory modernization, program of energy renovation of residential buildings, design and implementation of a new policy aimed at strengthening long-term residence for unaccompanied minors, extension of existing or construction of new metro lines in Athens and Thessaloniki, modernization of Spatial and Urban Planning Legislation, integrated National Spatial Strategy, upgrading of existing railways and building new ones, Road Traffic Code for the proper use of micro-mobility vehicles – Personal Light Electric Vehicles, funded National Civil Protection Program AEGIS.

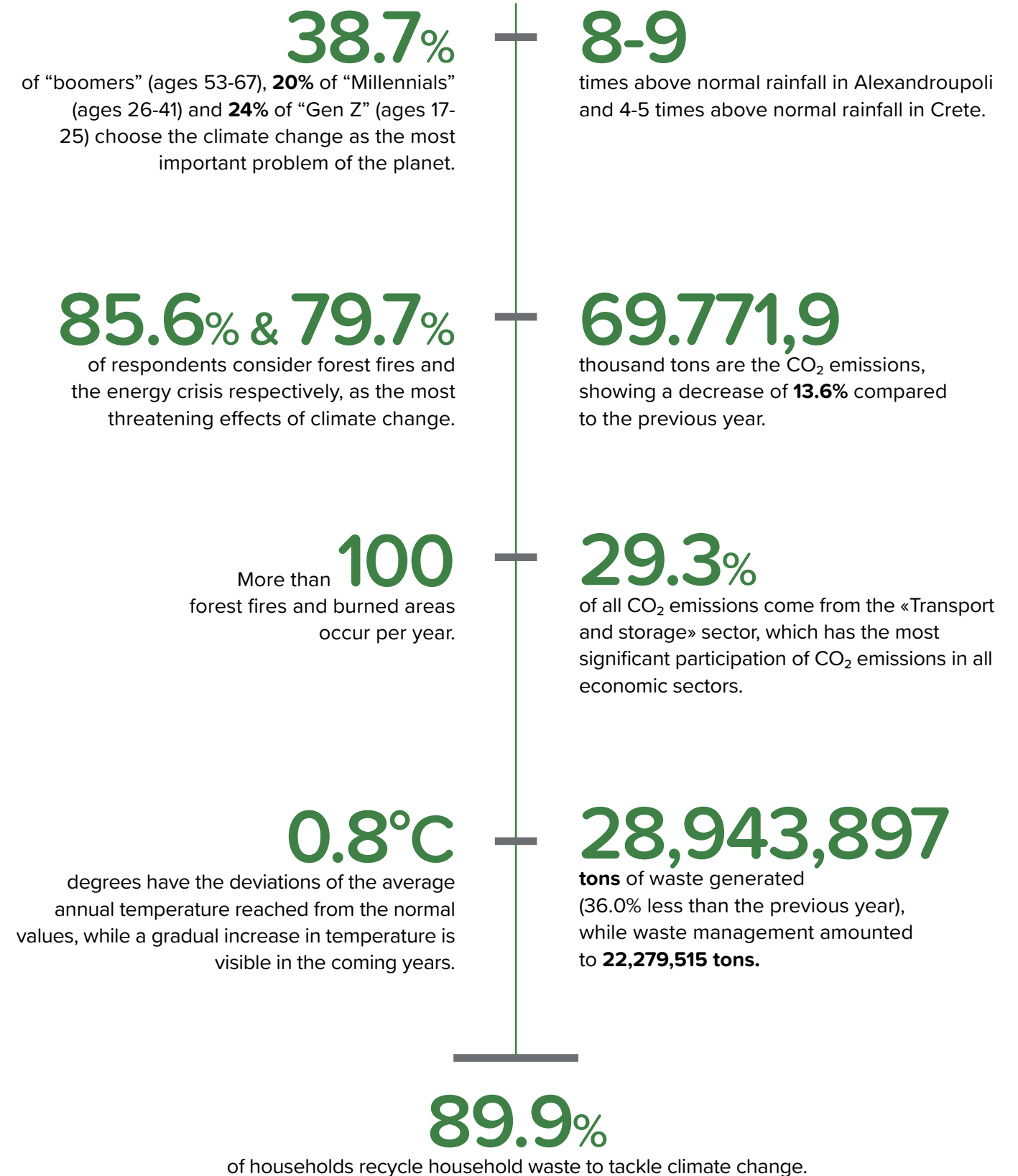
Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

The climate change is here, it concerns us all, it has been a fact for years, while the challenges and consequences we have to face from this phenomenon are many and urgently require the implementation of preventive policies and actions to deal with it. In Greece, climate change has led to more frequent and intense weather conditions, such as floods, heat waves, heavy snowfalls, fires, and draught. Therefore, priority should be given to initiatives and actions that could strengthen the country's resilience and adaptive capacity to climate-related risks and natural disasters. The problem of climate change requires coordinated solutions at the international level, as well as international cooperation so that developing countries can transition to a low-carbon economy. In addition, very important factors to prevent such phenomena, and to better deal with them by the competent authorities, are the clear distribution of roles and responsibilities of the parties involved, the utilization of technology and investment in it, as well as the availability of specialized personnel and necessary means of protection and special equipment. At the same time, raising public awareness of climate change for all age or social groups, including children, is sine qua non.

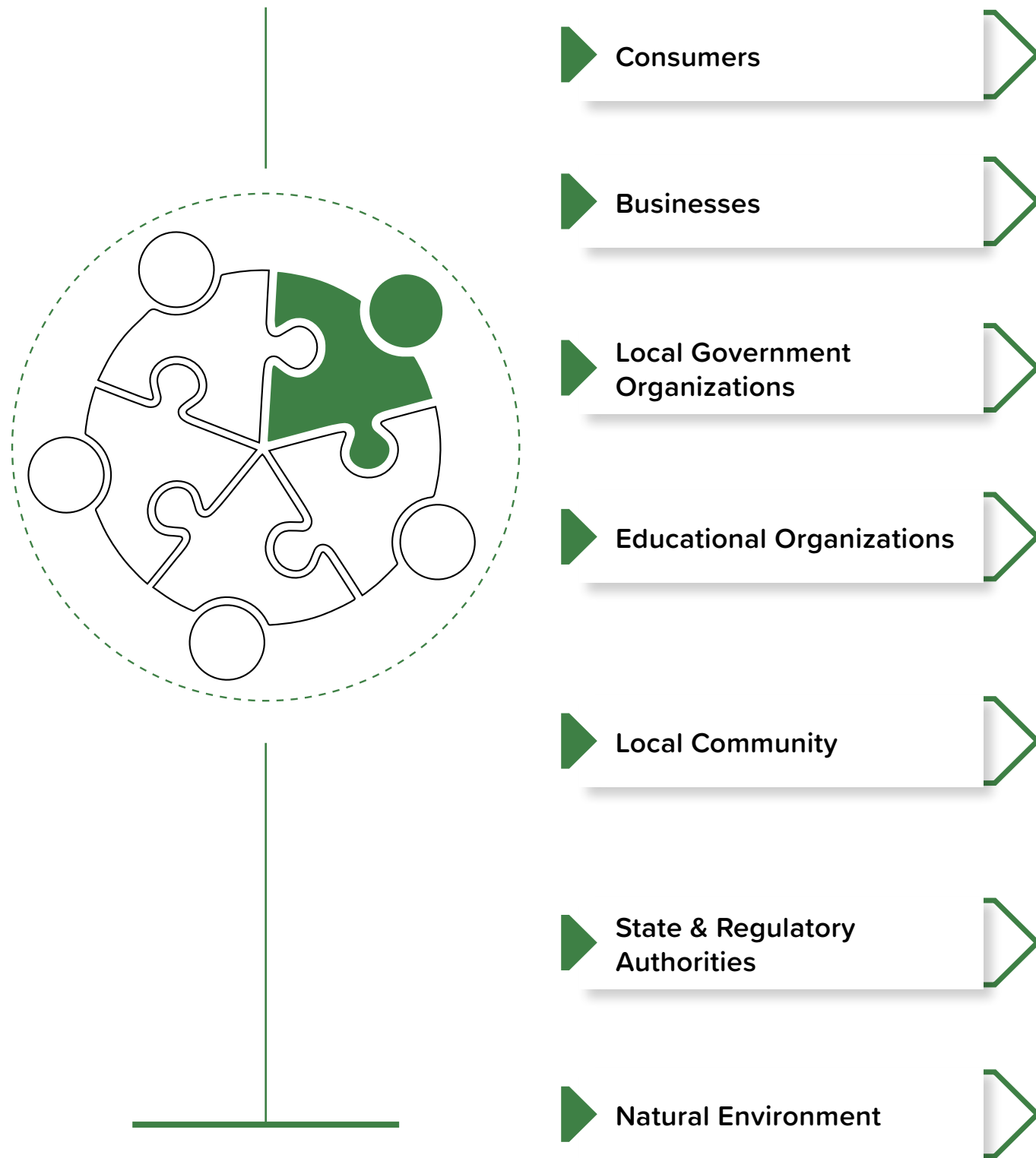

What are the main challenges they face?

- High cost to reduce personal environmental footprint and adoption of new habits, increased commuting
- High and increasing cost of adopting new low-carbon models (i.e., in transport, distribution network, fleet management, supply chain, procurement, production, office operation).
- Inadequate mechanisms, high cost and lack of skilled personnel to adopt greener solutions in the transport and mobility sector.
- Improving education, awareness, as well as human and institutional capacity related to climate change mitigation issues, adaptation, reduction of consequences and early warning.
- Poor management of climate change issues on a local level / Readiness to emergency situations that may be caused by natural disasters, bad weather etc., lack of action plans, skilled personnel, and special equipment to deal with unexpected events and natural disasters.
- Lack of resiliency and adaptive capacity of the country against risks and natural disasters that derive from climate change / Integration of climate change measures into national policies, strategies, and planning.
- Production of greenhouse gas emissions from transport, air pollution, increase in temperature / Extreme weather conditions, natural disasters (floods, fires etc.).

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● Consumers

Reduction of environmental footprint / Application of new technologies, application of special provisions in case of emergency or natural disaster, for people with disability (employees or visitors).

● Businesses

Application of National Action Plan for the reduction of CO₂ emissions in specific areas of activity (i.e., in air transport, in sea transport etc.), investments and subsidized NSRF Programs for green entrepreneurship, energy performance of buildings.

● Local Government Organizations

Investments in energy infrastructure and clean energy technologies, green transport, and investments: emerging in Smart Cities - Smart Destinations.

● Educational Organizations

Access to research and clean energy technology.

● Local Community

Implementation of National Adaptation Strategy through 13 Regional climate change Adaptation Action Plans, revision of the Health and Safety Measures Plan in the event of an emergency or natural disaster, investments in public transport and promotion of electric drive and «green transport».

● State & Regulatory Authorities

Adoption of National Plan for Energy and Climate (Green Transition), Application of Climate Law, implementation of the commitment undertaken by developed countries in the United Nations Contract -Framework on Climate Change, National Long-Term Strategy for 2050 to meet the commitments of the Paris Agreement, tax actions and measures, which promote and support the transition to a greener economy, including those related to personal income tax & employer income tax, Official Environment - Energy and Climate Change Adaptation Policy, National Risk Assessment and National Disaster Risk Management Plan, communications and informing the citizens about an emergency from the Hellenic Emergency Communications Service / Laws for the promotion of electric drive and provision of tax incentives for the purchase of electric vehicles and the installation of charging infrastructure - «Go Electric» Subsidy Program.

● Natural Environment

Regulatory arrangements by the State and Private Organizations to reduce greenhouse gas emissions - Performance indicators and evaluation.

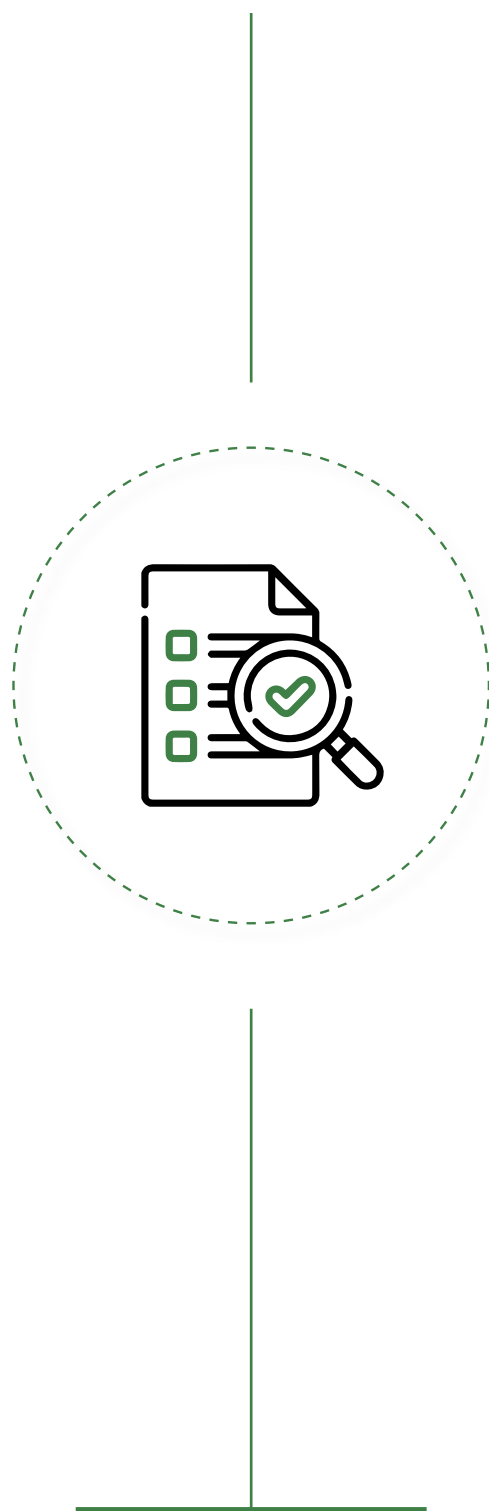

- ▶ Creation of more than 10,000 charging stations nationwide by 2027
- ▶ Production of renewable diesel by co-processing sustainable raw materials at the Thessaloniki refinery within 2024
- ▶ Participation in the "eFuel Alliance" to promote and develop synthetic liquid fuels
- ▶ Near-zero footprint of own-operated EKO and bp fuel stations in terms of energy consumption within 2023
- ▶ Promotion of environmentally sustainable aviation through the Group's subsidiary, EKO (SAF - Sustainable Aviation Fuel).

The implementation of "Vision 2025" has no end date. It is a process that takes into account international developments, being constantly updated, aiming to keep HELLENiQ ENERGY at the forefront of developments and to continue its leading role as a model company in the region.

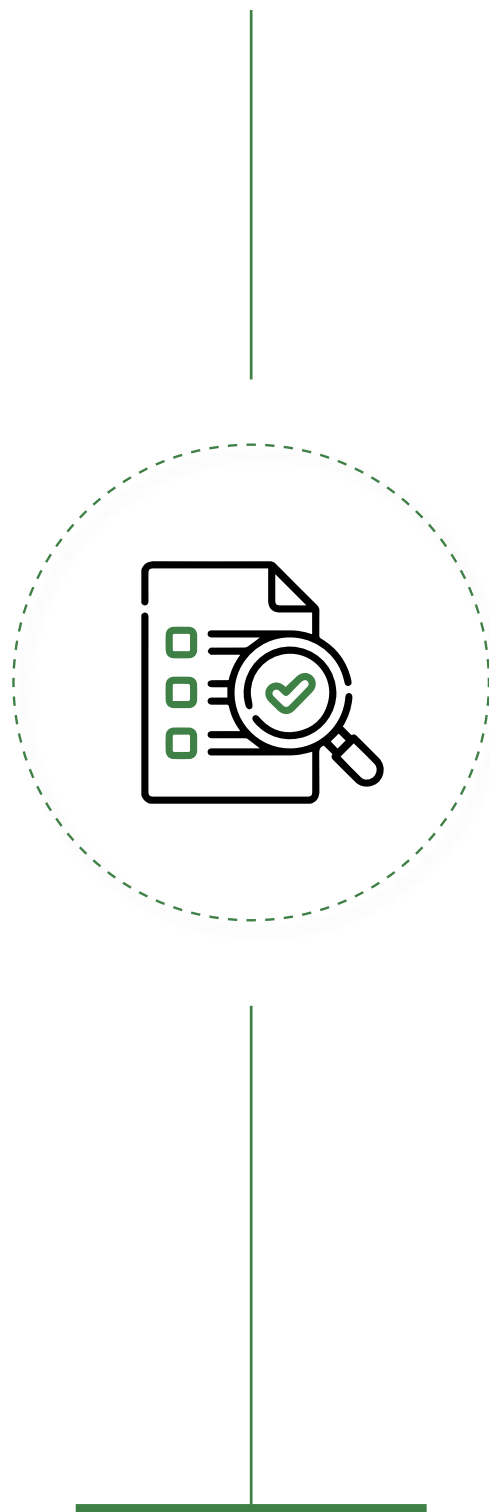

For Greece, an island country, whose economy is based above all on the sea and its tourism, the investment in the protection and preservation of marine biodiversity and ecosystems is essential. The aim is to adopt and implement strategies, policies, and actions to conserve marine natural resources, eliminate illegal fishing and promote an economically viable and competitive fishing and aquaculture industry. In addition, the promotion of the Blue Economy, through the development of offshore renewable energy sources and carbon-free «green» maritime transport, is an essential priority to achieve the objectives of European Green Agreement. The organization of human activities in coastal areas combined with the protection of the marine environment are the two determining factors that contribute to the sustainable development in marine areas and coastal zones. The careful management of this great global resource is key to a sustainable future!

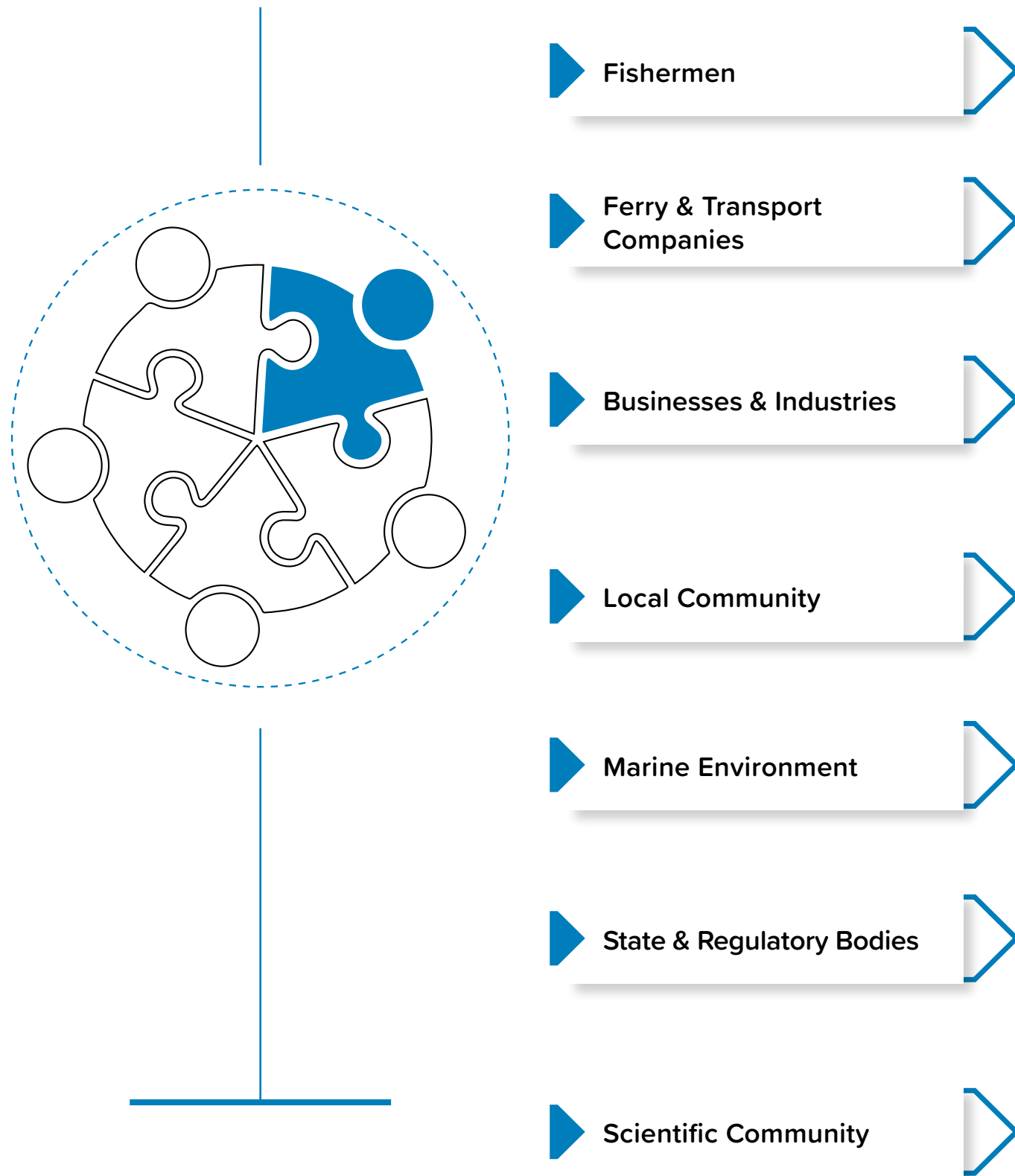

What are the main challenges they face?

- Overfishing, illegal, and unregulated fishing, destructive fishing techniques, preventing traditional small-scale fishers from accessing marine resources and markets.
- Lack of marine technology, air pollution from maritime transport, poor management of marine and coastal ecosystems, climate change phenomenon.
- Maximum contribution to water pollution through industrial solid and liquid waste disposal, sewage estuaries, marine litter, harmful substances, and other liquid effluents, pollution of the hard-to-reach coastline from fish farming – aquaculture.
- Exploitation and reckless use of the marine environment and natural resources, marine litter, developed tourism and excessive mobility - especially during the summer months, economic benefits for the islands.
- Pollution of seas and oceans – especially from land activities, marine litter, and nutrients, ocean acidification, destruction of underwater biodiversity.
- Fishing subsidies that contribute to excess fishing capacity and overexploitation, subsidies that contribute to illegal and unregulated fishing, difficulty in applying the international law as provided by the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea.
- Lack of scientific knowledge, research abilities and scientific cooperation for ocean acidification, lack of implementation of science-based management plans for the seas and fish stock, limited scientific evidence for coastal areas.

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● Fishermen

Responsible fishing activity aimed at producing the maximum sustainable catch performance as defined by their biological characteristics, compliance with laws and regulations through incentives from the State.

● Ferry & Transport Companies

Development of research abilities and transfer of marine technology, considering the Criteria and Guidelines related to Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission's Marine Technology Transfer.

● Businesses & Industries

Implementation of modern solid and liquid industrial waste and hazardous effluents management systems, investment, and implementation of circular economy practices at the production process.

● Local Community

Sustainable use of marine resources through the viable management of fishing, aquaculture, and tourism.

● Marine Environment

Sustainable management and protection of marine and coastal ecosystems to reduce all forms of sea pollution, marine environment restoration actions for healthy and productive seas.

● State & Regulatory Bodies

Establishment of a legal framework for Marine Spatial Planning in Greece (National Strategy of Marine Spatial Planning & Marine Spatial Plans) from 2018 - transfer of EU's relative Regulation - as a tool to achieve the sustainable development of marine life, marine areas and sustainable use of marine resources, promoting the Blue Economy and integrating the political framework and the current legislation introduced by the EU Green Agreement taking into account the New Strategy of EU for the Adaptation to Climate Change. Planning and implementation of initiatives to deal with the invasive alien species in the marine environment, legislative reform for a National Strategy for a Completed Marine Policy with regard to island territories, comprehensive implementation of the EU's Common Fishery Policy (CFP) for the termination of overfishing and illegal and unregulated fishing within the framework of the Fisheries and Shipping Operational Program.

● Scientific Community

Investment and reinforcement of scientific cooperation on all levels, creating management plans based on science, research, education and increase of scientific knowledge.

COSMOTE BLUE - We are taking action to protect our seas



The Greek blue of our sea is precious for every aspect of our life. With a sense of responsibility, with the [COSMOTE BLUE initiative](#), we are taking action to do everything to protect it, contributing to mitigate the risks that threaten it and protect the biodiversity of our deep seas.

We are starting our actions by joining forces with [ENALEIA](#), the social enterprise that is at the forefront of the fight to protect the sea from plastic pollution and fish stock depletion.

● We are collecting over 90 tons of plastic

With the help of professional fishermen and by making use of over 45 fishing boats from ENALEIA's network, we collect plastic from the seabed and hard-to-reach coasts in the Argo-Saronic Gulf, the Thermaic Gulf, the Chalkidiki and Crete, areas accounting for over 40% of the plastic found in Greece.

● We return a great portion of the plastic to the circular economy

We manage plastic waste responsibly and aim to incorporate over half of it into the circular economy, turning more than 52 tons of plastic into new products (socks, jackets, shoes or even furniture), thus preventing the use of new natural resources that would otherwise burden the environment.

● We train over 200 professional fishermen

We provide training to fishermen so that they can learn to implement sustainable fishing methods and clean-up practices and manage their fishing gear responsibly, thereby helping to mitigate marine pollution and reduce the rate of fish stock depletion.

● We are increasing the circular economy chain

By recycling the plastic, we collect from the sea, we essentially help to deal with marine pollution and protect the biodiversity of our seabeds. At the same time, however, we apply the principles of the circular economy in practice, inspiring and inviting consumers to recycle their old device at a COSMOTE or GERMANOS store and become links in this chain.

We have a noble cause to save our seas

The Hellenic Marine Environment Protection Association (HELMEPA), founded in 1982 with the mission to “save the seas” is one of the most impactful environmental organizations, leading the way in protecting seas and coasts, ensuring safety at sea, and promoting sustainable development.

Over the years, the HELMEPA movement has grown exponentially, with a community of nearly **300,000 volunteers** dedicated to its cause.

Forty years later, the Association has evolved into an open participatory platform consisting of **336 companies** and organizations in Greece and abroad, over 2,300 ocean-going vessels, and 14,200 seafarers, with an extensive network of stakeholders worldwide. Its international impact has inspired and led to the establishment of similar organizations (MEPAs) in Cyprus, Nigeria, Philippines, Turkey, Ukraine, the United States of America, and Uruguay, all members of the International Maritime Environmental Protection Association (INTERMEPA), with HELMEPA acting as permanent secretariat.

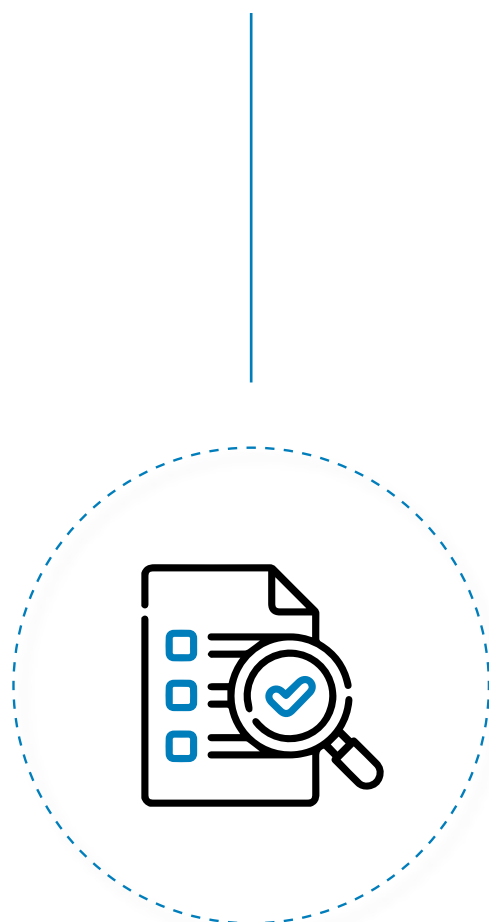
Standing alongside the new generation, HELMEPA maintains a longstanding relationship of trust and interaction with future leaders through its programs. HELMEPA Junior (ages 5-11), which was launched in Greek schools in 1993, HELMEPA Cadets (ages 12-18), and Youth Ambassadors (15+). To date, **450,000 students** have visited our Junior exhibitions, and 136,000 students have participated in 45,000 environmental activities, along with 8,640 teachers-volunteers, gaining valuable knowledge about the role of the oceans. HELMEPA's Junior Educational Program is part of the Skills Labs of the Hellenic Ministry of Education.

HELMEPA Scholarships have been awarded since 1998, offering the opportunity to 56 young scientists to continue their postgraduate studies in shipping and environmental sciences.

HELMEPA's **certified Maritime Training Centre** has been instrumental in delivering educational and refresher training initiatives to over 27,000 merchant marine officers and shore-based personnel, including hands-on experience, made possible through the Association's Full Mission Bridge Simulator.

HELMEPA is the national coordinator (for 33 years) of International Coastal Cleanup, the largest volunteer event of its kind worldwide, with over 15 million volunteers globally. With its emblematic Seagull figure at the forefront, HELMEPA has coordinated **4,200 coastal and underwater cleanups**, collecting 850 tons of waste along 2,500 km of coastline.

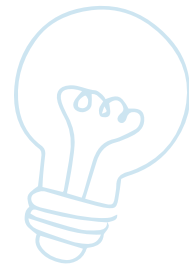

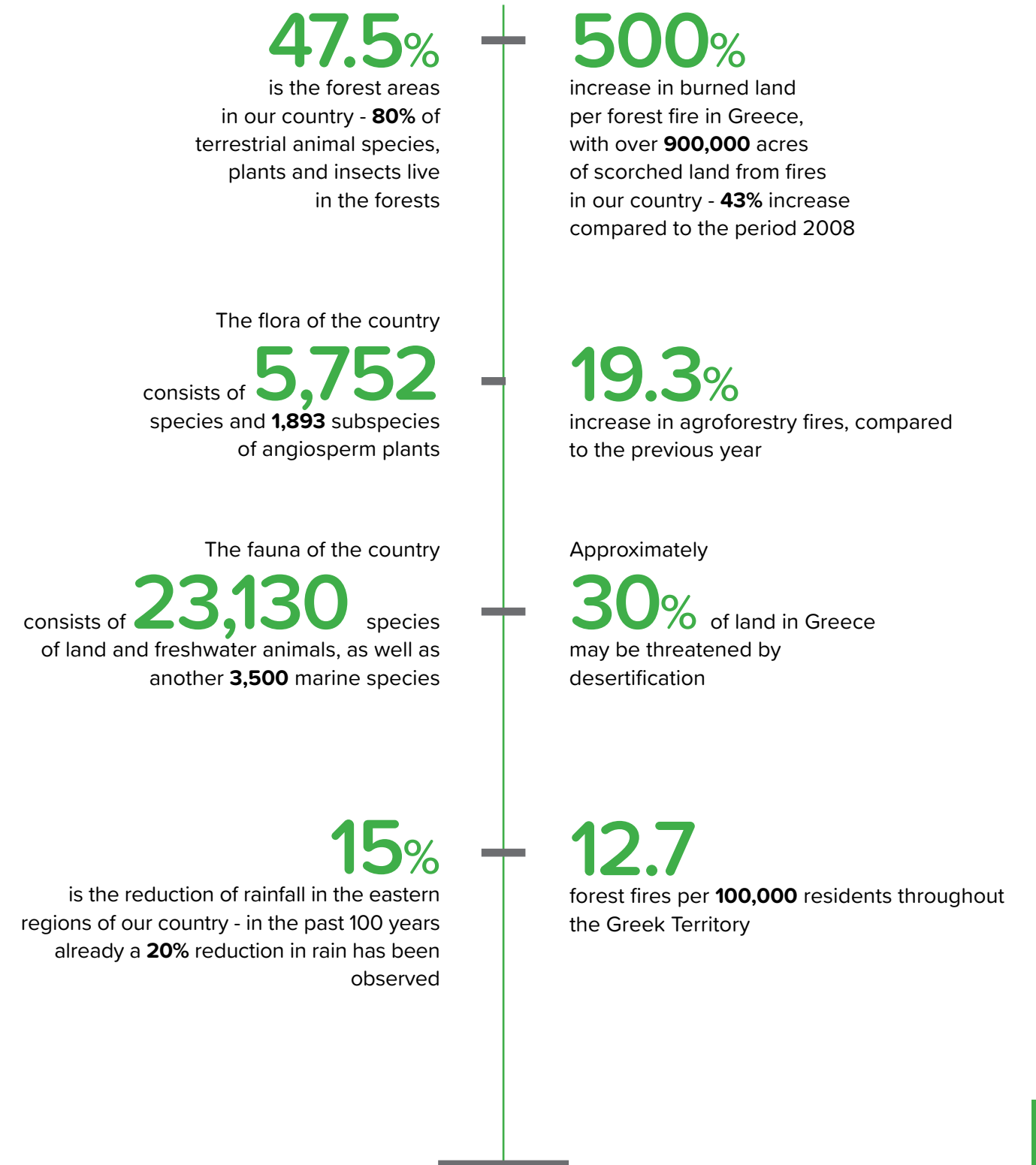

The loss of biodiversity and forest areas has intensified in the last decade in our country. Every year, Greece faces a serious risk of fires, especially in the summer months, which have made it imperative to stop deforestation and combat desertification. It is more necessary than ever to review a national plan for the protection and management of the natural environment and biodiversity, reforestation, dealing with natural disasters, the validation of forest maps and the further development of initiatives for the protection of habitats and wetlands in Greece. The legislative framework is now strong, but additional measures must be taken for its full implementation. Nature is our second home, and we should take care of all protected species. A significant accomplishment of the past decade for our country is the increase in terrestrial sites characterized by Natura 2000.



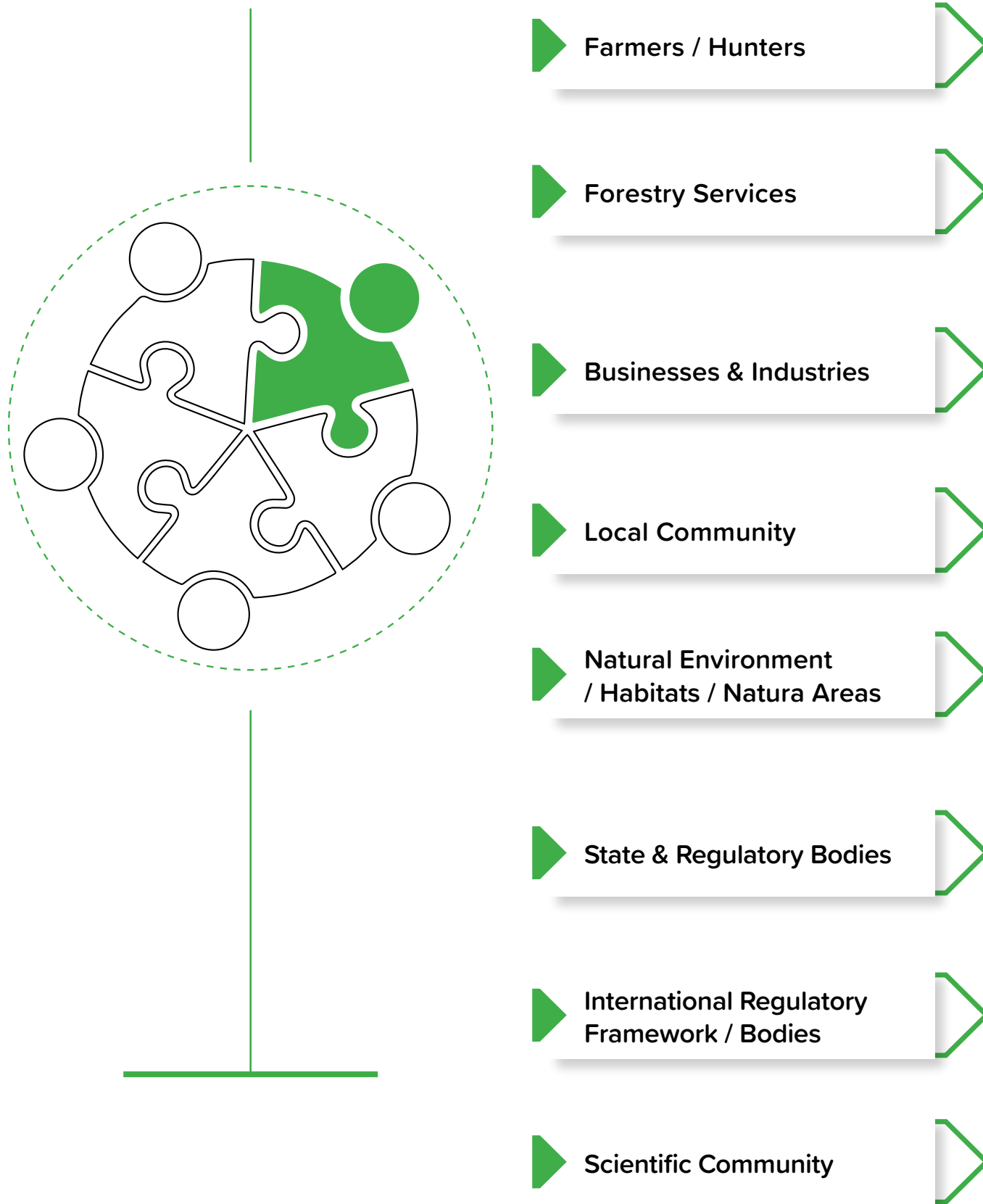

What are the main challenges they face?

Illegal hunting and farming activity, lack of a clear framework for compliance with the laws or regulations, insufficient information on forest land boundaries.

Pressures from the external environment and from external factors such as urban sprawl and forest fire, obligations of the country to co-shape the strategy for the adaptation of forest areas to climate change and its mitigation.

Implementation of a sustainability framework to mitigate their effects on the phenomenon of climate change, evaluation of their performance based on ESG criteria, need for green financing, high cost of adopting new technologies and preparing studies for the protection of the natural environment.

Exploitation and reckless use of the natural environment and natural resources, litter, land waste, developed tourism and excessive mobility -especially during the summer months.

Waste of natural resources by individuals and businesses, destruction and pollution of the natural environment, natural disasters such as fires and floods, extinction of rare species of birds and animals, and insufficient protection of species, noise.

Need for substantial cooperation with the local communities, partners and with international agencies, assessment of the conservation status of species and habitats, need to strengthen and update the national planning for nature protection agencies, climate change and adaption of policies for the protection of biodiversity at a National level.

Limited implementation of standards and framework on an international level for protected areas NATURA 2000, difficulty in adopting policies about biodiversity.

Shortages in specialized human resources, methods, techniques, technologies, research, know-how and financial resources for the preparation of environmental studies and management plans of Natura 2000 areas.

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● **Farmers / Hunters**

Responsible farming and hunting activity, compliance with laws and regulations, establishment of a reliable cadastral system and protection of residents' property through forest maps, implementation of the code of agricultural practice to adopt policies and measures aimed at protecting and maintaining the high productivity of rural land, to avoid its loss and degradation.

● **Forestry Services**

Validation of forest maps and digitalization of the area to facilitate, plan and permit new investments throughout the country, protect and manage forest areas in a more sustainable and efficient way, implement a System of Inventory and Monitoring of the country's forests and forest areas for the calculation of CO₂ emissions per area, natural disasters and catastrophic events, construction - rehabilitation of fire protection roads, construction of water supply points, forest management actions, anti-corrosion and anti-flooding projects at the mountains.

● **Businesses & Industries**

Implementation of waste management and recycling systems, adoption of a governance system to protect biodiversity, implementation of measures to avoid soil and groundwater contamination from the production process, tree planting and other CSR environmental actions to restore the areas where they operate.

● **Local Community**

Sustainable use of natural resources and tourism, efficient interaction and cooperation with management agencies, opportunities for experience and knowledge, implementation of a reforestation plan in the areas affected by the devastating forest fires, safer real estate transactions.

● **Natural Environment / Habitats / Natura Areas**

Enhanced natural protection measures, strengthening of forest areas, zoning of NATURA 2000 protected areas, economic development of network areas based on the principles of sustainable development, protected areas management plans, conservation, and protection of wild birds' fauna.

● **State & Regulatory Bodies**

Modernization of environmental legislation, simplification of licensing procedures, implementation of UN standards, creation of National Environmental and Climate Change Agency (NECCA) for the coordination and supervision of the country's protected areas management bodies, development of a National Biodiversity Strategy and its Action Plan (NBSAP), and National Reforestation Plan for the country as part of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan, creation and implementation of a National Rural Development Program, construction of public works in an environmentally friendly manner, construction of anti-flooding works and rehabilitation works of the affected areas.

● **International Regulatory Framework / Bodies**

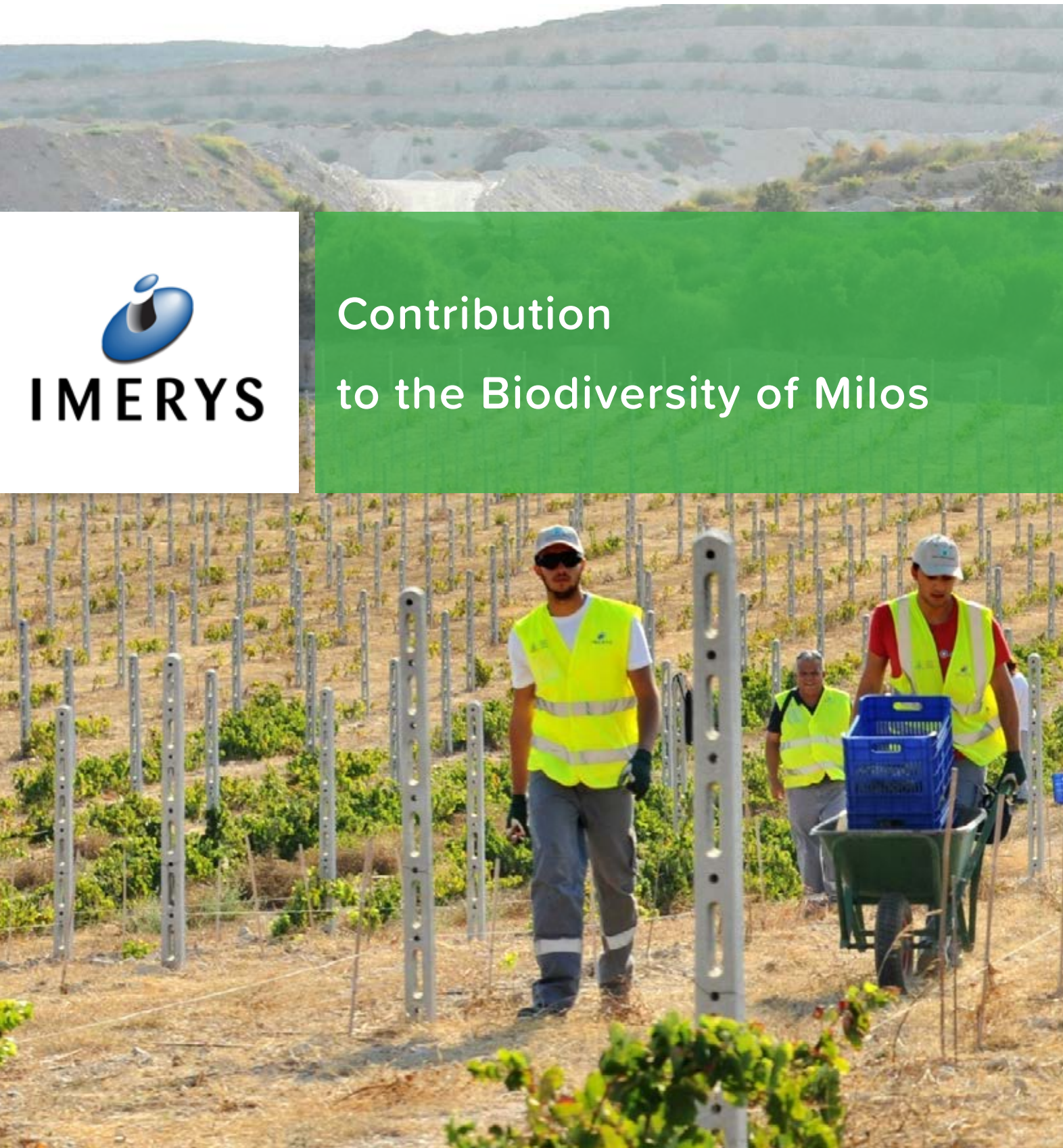

Contribution to the Biodiversity of Milos

Reducing IMERYYS' biodiversity footprint and [protecting and restoring nature](#) is key to our social license to operate, our reputation and our ability to access vital mineral resources in the long term. Our ultimate goal is no net loss of biodiversity, having outlined this commitment as a signatory to the [act4nature](#) Business Commitments for Biodiversity.

In Milos island, our company contributes to the balanced development of the island, implementing good practices and strengthening the harmonious coexistence of mining and tourism. Thus, by creating optimal conditions, nature is successfully reintroduced into the mine.

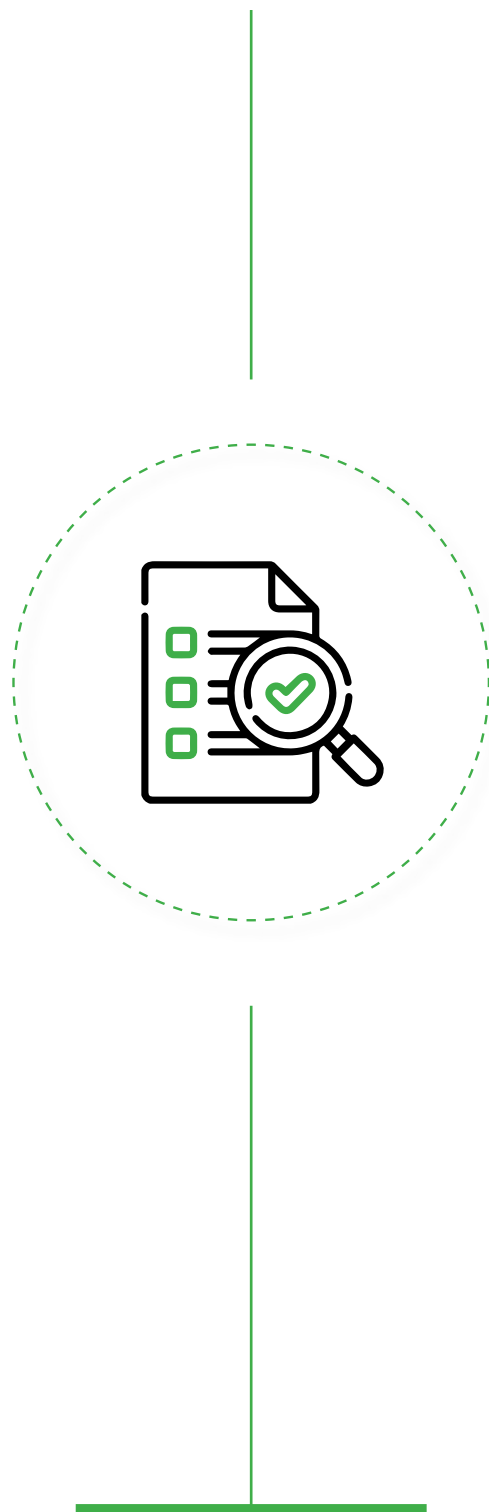
Systematic landscape restoration has already been established in the mines of Milos and the necessary infrastructure has been in place for decades: dedicated Department led by forester, plant nursery and specialized equipment, steady financing, and continuous R&D. Every year, with the contribution of IMERYYS, around 20,000 local plant species, bushes and trees, and approximately 1,100 kg of local plant seeds are collected, prepared in the company's owned nursery's Seed Germinating Chamber, and re-introduced to reclaimed areas and other degraded areas from fires, overgrazing or other human interventions.

In recent years, IMERYYS in collaboration with the Environmental Restoration Department of Milos, went a step beyond landscape restoration and, considering the principles of Sustainable Development, created an organic vineyard, enhancing the area's biodiversity. The planting of 17,500 vines of a Cycladic variety (Assyrtiko) was completed, followed by red Cycladic varieties, 3,000 Mavrotragano plants, 1,700 Mantilaria plants and 100 Psarosyriko plants were planted. In addition, the IMERYYS nursery in Milos reproduces rare and endemic plant species with the aim of using them in the restoration work of its mines on the island.

In conclusion, the following achievements have been noted from the above actions:

- ▶ Encouraging the residents of Milos to use more environmentally friendly agricultural methods
- ▶ Creation of new jobs for locals, strengthening of volunteerism and establishment of new vineyards
- ▶ Offering open educational seminars to local people on viticulture methods, with a remarkable participation of 60 - 100 people each time
- ▶ Educational visits of local community schools to the nursery
- ▶ Valuable know-how on the other Cycladic islands.

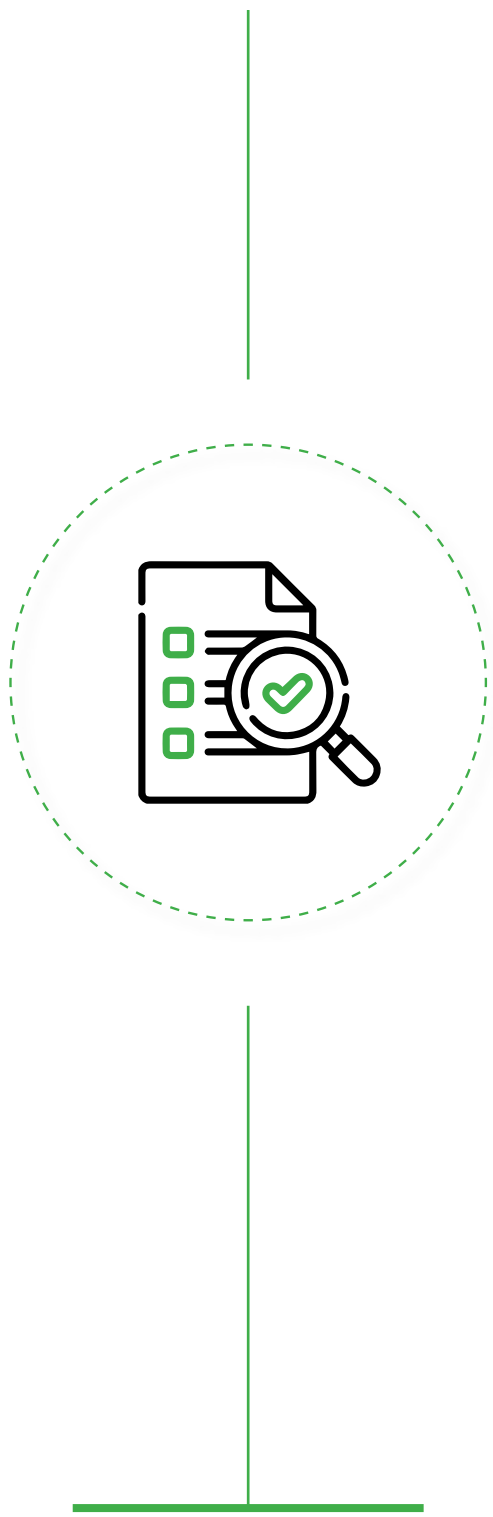

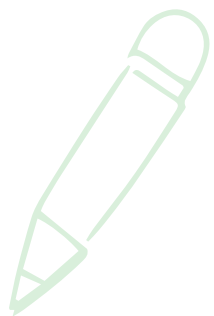

What are the main challenges they face?

Violence, discriminations, lack of opportunities, inequalities, financial problems, reduced incomes, poor living conditions, poor personal hygiene, racism due to reasons of race, national origin, color, religion, language, disability, sexual orientation and gender identity, xenophobia, anti-Semitism and intolerance, delinquency.

Intrafamilial violence, tortures, large number of unaccompanied children, limited adoptions, inadequate and slow adoption system.

Corruption and bribery incidents throughout the value chain, insufficient promotion of public accountability capacity, lack of prevention mechanisms and policies against corruption and financial crime.

Controversial justice system, significant cost and delays due to inflexible procedures, and insufficient use of Information and Communications Technology, fragmented legislation, and a lack of critical statistics.

Need to improve accountability mechanisms in each public administration body, promote cooperation and transparency between various state institutions and stakeholders, to enrich democratic consultation and decision-making processes.

What is the value created by the development of Public Policies and Measures



● **Vulnerable Social Groups**

Promotion and implementation of anti-discrimination laws & sustainable development policies, UN Security Council resolution on women, peace, and security (WPS) coordinated by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs - National Action Plan for women, re-establishment of the National Council against Racism and Intolerance, a Guide to the rights of victims of racist crimes, significant reduction in all forms of violence, reduction in the death rate due to criminality.

Substantial reduction of all forms of corruption and bribery through the implementation of a powerful government framework, implementation of anti-bribery and anti-corruption policies, implementation of ESG framework, participatory and representative decision-making by women, new corporate governance framework for listed / anonymous companies, internal control, compliance, modernization of the public sector recruitment system (Supreme Council for Civil Personnel Selection - ASEP), Regulations for the Protection of Personal Data (GDPR), National Strategy to fight against the legalization of money laundering from illegal activities.

● **Businesses**

Promotion of the rule of law, equal access to justice for all, creation of a centralized information system to support the functions of civil and criminal courts, Establishment of a Judicial Data Collection and Processing Office (JustStat), acceleration of trial of pending cases for settlement of debts.

● **National Authorities & Public Functions**

Digital Governance, Digital Accessibility to regulate the accessibility requirements of public sector websites and mobile applications, Open Data, Digital Transparency Program, creation of a Register of Greek Public Administration Websites for everyone through the Unified Digital Portal of Public Administration (GOV.GR), reducing of illicit money and weapon flows, strengthening of the recovery and return of stolen assets, combating all forms of organized crime, public access to information for citizens and protection of fundamental freedoms, National Anti-Corruption Strategy, amending the Income Tax Code and introducing tax incentives to increase electronic transactions, tax compliance, Anti-Crime Policy Program, National Crises and Risk Management Mechanism, establishment of the Ministry of Climate Crisis and Citizen Protection.

Integrating SDGs and ESG Factor for a Sustainable Corporate world

Integrating SDGs and ESG Factor for a Sustainable Corporate world

Introduction

The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) framework was adopted in 2015 by the United Nations Members, as part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. It contains 17 interconnected goals addressing a wide range of global challenges, including poverty, inequality, climate change, environmental deprivation, peace, and justice, among others.

Environmental, Social, and Governance, widely known as ESG factors, is a set of criteria used to measure the sustainability and ethical impact of an organization, either public or private. These factors have become essential tools for investors and stakeholders to evaluate corporate behaviors and determine the future financial performance of businesses.

In today's rapidly evolving and challenging business landscape, the integration of SDGs and ESG factors is a fundamental necessity, as consumers become more socially and environmentally conscious, and businesses are pressed to demonstrate responsibility apart from profitability. The alignment with SDGs and a strong ESG profile not only puts companies at the forefront of sustainable and ethical practices but also mitigates long-term risks, fosters innovation, and drives enduring value.

Understanding the SDGs & ESG Factors

The 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) (Figure 1) serve as a universal plan to collectively address the most urging global challenges of our time, namely to eradicate poverty in all its forms, combat rising inequalities, and ensure environmental sustainability. With a holistic approach, these goals also purport to address the need for urgent climate action, to develop peaceful societies, and envision a just world where institutions work effectively and inclusively for everyone.

The E factor of ESG (Figure 2) refers to a company's impact on the environment and how a business

manages its carbon footprint, waste management, water conservation, and other related issues. Social (S) focuses on how companies manage relationships with their employees, suppliers, customers, local community, etc., and includes aspects like human rights, labor standards, and corporate social responsibility initiatives. Governance is about a company's leadership, executive pay, audits, internal controls, and shareholder rights. Its focus is on the system of rules, practices, and processes by which a company is directed and controlled.

Investors and stakeholders closely monitor companies' ESG performance because it offers insights into a firm's long-term sustainability, ethical practices, and risk management. Our research findings show that a strong ESG performance often correlates with better financial results, resilience to market volatility, and enhanced reputation. Conversely, poor ESG practices can signify potential liabilities, regulatory challenges, and mismanagement, which can adversely affect a company's value and growth prospects.

Connection between SDGs & ESG

The SDGs have two key aims: the reduction of global poverty and the halting of climate change, recognizing the link between the two. Therefore, by addressing the various dimensions of sustainability, including environmental protection, social wellbeing, and economic prosperity, the SDGs contribute to the improvement of ESG outcomes as well.

The interconnectedness of SDGs and ESG factors can be observed in several ways. For example, Goal 13: Climate Action directly addresses the environmental factor by aiming to combat climate change and its impacts. Organizations can contribute to achieving this goal while improving their environmental performance, through the effective implementation of climate policies, the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions, and the promotion of clean energy.

Our research underlines the importance of a sound performance in ESG factors for a good financial performance of private business and describes specifically how the ESG framework can be transposed

into a more holistic framework integrating the SDGs. This can help companies measure the SDG footprint of their financial portfolios, through ESG KPIs and this is of particular importance after the introduction of the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive (CSRD) in 2022. It is proved that by achieving specific KPIs, companies would not only improve their ESG performance but also contribute to the broader SDGs.

The SDG-ESG link has profound implications for sustainable development, business practices, policy-making, and long-term sustainability strategies. It provides a holistic approach to measuring and managing a company's impact on society and the environment. By integrating SDGs into their ESG strategy, companies can ensure they're contributing positively to global sustainability objectives. This alignment can drive better business practices, stimulating innovation and efficiency while reducing risks. Policymakers can use the SDG-ESG link to set regulations and incentives that encourage sustainable practices. For long-term sustainability strategies, understanding this link can help identify trends and areas of focus that are most likely to create positive impacts and financial returns. This link also allows investors and stakeholders to gauge the performance of a company or portfolio not only from a financial perspective but also in terms of sustainable development contribution.

Conclusion

In conclusion, the interconnections between SDGs and ESG factors reveal the complex, multifaceted nature of sustainable development and emphasize the need for integrated efforts. The link between the SDGs and ESG calls for integrated approaches to achieve sustainable development globally, in Europe, and in national contexts. By aligning ESG strategies with the SDGs, companies, policymakers, and society can contribute to a more inclusive, resilient, and sustainable future.

The importance of compliance by listed companies with the ESG criteria

Europe today holds the reins as the most developed market for sustainable investment. In my opinion, the importance that investors now attach to these issues is nothing less than fulfilling the demand of consumers and investors respectively for socially and environmentally responsible companies and for companies that have good governance and transparency in the way they operate.

Towards these objectives, HCMC has included sustainable finance in its priorities and has initiated a timely and intensive process of raising awareness of ESG characteristics (Environment - Society - Governance) among all market participants and the public. As an example, HCMC organised in Greece an international conference in June 2022 - with the participation of the chairs of the three ESAs (ESMA, EBA & EIOPA), the Bank of Greece, representatives of associations and large listed companies - which had great impact and significant contribution to the process of transition towards sustainable finance. It is also foreseen that HCMC will be supported by

the TSI 2023 technical tool on this topic, an action that will further strengthen the role of the EC in promoting sustainability objectives.

Focusing in particular on listed companies and corporate governance, which is one of the three pillars of sustainable finance, I would like to point out that EU law now requires some large public companies to disclose information on how they operate and manage social and environmental challenges. This helps investors, civil society organisations, consumers, policy makers and other stakeholders to assess the non-financial performance of these large companies and encourages these companies to develop a responsible approach to business.

The relevant institutional framework includes the Non-Financial Reporting Disclosure Directive ("NFRD") and, in parallel, Article 8 of the EU TAXONOMY. To provide such information, companies can rely on national, European or international

frameworks, specifying which framework they relied on. Note that the information included in the "Non-Financial Statement" of the Management Report of large listed companies, is now supervised by HCMC. In addition, the European "Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive" has recently been adopted which, among other things, amends the existing NFRD reporting requirements and significantly expands the scope of application.

It is therefore clear that in the new era, listed companies wishing to be attractive to investors will need to implement ESG alignment strategies and develop a strategy as to how to integrate these criteria into their policies. It is worth noting that parameter G (Governance) is of key importance since, among other things, it provides companies with the supporting governance framework for the green transition and, more generally, for all sustainability objectives. To this end, Greek law 4706/2020 updated and strengthened the corporate governance framework for listed companies, taking

into account the current global trends in corporate governance issues.

In this regard, I would also like to refer to the well-known and important work of the OECD on corporate governance issues. I am honoured to be part of the Bureau of the OECD's Corporate Governance Committee and in this capacity I would like to point out that both the recent OECD Corporate Governance Factbook and the G20/OECD Principles of Corporate Governance Review are available to the public. The OECD Corporate Governance Factbook provides easily accessible and up-to-date information on the institutional, legal and regulatory frameworks for corporate governance in 50 countries worldwide.

On the other hand, the revised Corporate Governance Principles include a new chapter entitled "Sustainability and Resilience", which provides recommendations to support companies in managing the risks and opportunities of climate transition and other sustainability challenges.

To meet our greatest environmental challenges, whether in the form of the just transition to net zero, or tackling biodiversity loss, we must ensure that, globally, our financial ecosystem supports our natural ecosystem. Such a transformation requires the realignment of capital on a huge scale alongside bold and coordinated policy making, and for these to converge in new and innovative ways. The will is there: businesses are adapting; policy is evolving; and finance is mobilising. And one thing is clear: we must transform our global economy into a global green economy.

In this green financial ecosystem, Athex plays a pivotal role in three key areas: we are encouraging capital flows towards the green economy and the low carbon transition; we are building and fostering dialogue between companies, investors and policy makers; and we are advocating for more uniform standards of disclosure and data to building investor trust in the Greek capital market enable capital to flow into the right direction.

And it is particularly encouraging that in recent years, Greek companies have been adopting sustainable business practices and putting increasing focus

on ESG disclosure. Beyond the pure compliance aspect, reporting on how ESG initiatives relate to strategy and financial performance can help a company build a more attractive investment profile and, consequently, get better access to capital.

Since joining the United Nations Sustainable Stock Exchanges (SSE) initiative in 2018, ATHEX has undertaken a series of initiatives to raise awareness among companies and the broader Greek capital market ecosystem regarding ESG issues.

In 2019, ATHEX published the first edition of the ESG Reporting Guide, a practical tool that enables both listed and non-listed companies to identify and disclose material ESG information to all stakeholders. In March 2022, we updated the content of the Guide to incorporate the most recent international and European standards and regulations. In July 2021, ATHEX launched the ATHEX ESG Index, which monitors the stock market performance of ATHEX-listed companies that disclose adequate ESG information in accordance with our Guide. The Index has served as an added incentive for listed companies to incorporate sustainability considerations in their strategy and their business

practices and enhance their ESG disclosures.

In January 2022, ATHEX introduced the "ATHEX BONDS GREENet" information unit, where information about ESG bonds, including Green, Social, Sustainable, and Sustainability-Linked Bonds, listed on our markets, is centralized and displayed. Currently, 5 ESG bonds that have raised more than EUR1bn are listed on ATHEX and are featured on the "ATHEX BONDS GREENet."

Furthermore, in order to raise awareness and to promote better understanding of ESG matters, ATHEX has organized a series of educational seminars for board members and senior corporate executives. The course aims to enable Greek companies to more effectively manage the relevant ESG risks as well as more easily identify the ESG opportunities related to their business. Collaborations with market participants further promote the importance of sustainable development for Greek companies' strategies, emphasizing the visibility and enhancement of awareness of listed companies on sustainability matters.

The most recent initiative of the Athens Exchange

Group in 2023, is the launch of the ATHEX ESG Data Portal, a new digital tool for collecting ESG information. This platform aims to serve as a central ESG data repository for Greek companies, listed and non-listed alike, as well as for investors seeking standardized and, consequently, more easily comparable information.

The Athens Stock Exchange closely monitors international developments and initiatives by European Union institutions, with the goal of identifying significant opportunities for the Greek market to become an attractive hub for responsible investments. It is important to remember that sustainable development represents an opportunity for positive change. Businesses and individuals are now more inspired than ever to do the right thing, collaborate, innovate with the common goal of building a more sustainable future for all, where ESG is "business as usual"

As a stock market operator, we have the opportunity - and the duty - to utilize our central role in the Greek capital market ecosystem and we will continue to work together with all stakeholders to accelerate the transition towards a low-carbon economy.
